ABOUT The report

Year 2020 is coming to an end; the year of COVID-19 and probably the hardest one which an increasingly globalised world has had to face. However, despite the difficulties, not only we have managed to adapt ourselves and maintain most of the projects planned in the Foundation's four priority areas for action (education, culture, society and the environment), but we have also achieved to establish multiple specific and extraordinary lines of support to tackle the situations derived from COVID-19.

Thus, this 2020...

- We have strengthened our commitment to education and research, transforming our education programme 'Viva Nuestra Energía' (Long live our energy) into a digital and multilingual platform, which has allowed many more schoolchildren aged between 6 and 16 to access its contents, as well as supporting scientific and biomedical research through our collaboration with the DIPC (Donostia International Physics Center) and the FINBA (Asturias Foundation for Biomedical Research and Innovation).
- We have maintained our commitment to culture through 'Arte Público' (Public art), a design competition for art, architecture and design students; our support to #nosolopoetry, an online multimedia channel to spread poetry on a national and international level; and our collaboration with the opera seasons, symphony concerts and piano sessions organised in Asturias and the Basque

Country, as well as with the chamber music cycles held in the dome of the Centro Niemeyer in Avilés.

- It should be highlighted the special collaboration we have maintained with the Princess of Asturias Foundation and the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao.
- We have increased our collaboration in the social area, by creating specific support programmes for social entities to tackle the crisis derived from COVID-19, and by strengthening the programmes of EDP Solidaria (EDP Solidarity) and Energía Solidaria (Solidarity Energy), aimed at improving our society through the promotion of equal access to energy and the fostering of rural development and elderly people care.
- We have maintained our commitment to the environment, supporting our forests and rivers.

The foregoing is just a small sample of the multiple and varied initiatives the EDP Foundation has developed during this complicated year 2020, and which may be consulted on the website <u>www.fundacionedp.es</u>. 

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MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

OF THE EDP FOUNDATION Manuel Menéndez Menéndez

> 'In such a complex setting, with a multidimensional crisis to face, we have tried to fulfil the mission of the EDP Foundation, strengthening the Group's commitment in the geographical areas in which it performs its activity.'


2020 has been also the year in which we have launched a new programme to foster art and creation, the 'Arte Público' (Public


Art) programme, and the year in which we have announced an extraordinary initiative for the support of social entities, aware that their work is indispensable to overcome the crisis in which we are immersed.







TO SOCIETY

Through the EDP Solidaria programme, the EDP Foundation has supported sustainable projects that allow to improve the quality of life of people; these projects are mainly focused on the promotion of energy efficiency, rural development and elderly people care. Extraordinarily, in October, it launched the EDP Solidaria COVID-19 initiative, in order to tackle the exceptional circumstances derived from COVID-19.

TO EDUCATION AND RESEARCH

The Foundation training programme has allowed more than 150 university students to supplement their training in different EDP offices and to actively participate in their first job experience. Likewise, EDP's staff has telematically contributed to strengthen the organisational skills of the social entities and thus, to improve their impact and efficiency. The EDP Foundation has collaborated with biomedical research for the creation of new medicines, supporting the activities of the Asturias Foundation for Biomedical Research and Innovation (FINBA).

TO CULTURE

The EDP Foundation has announced the 'Concurso de Ideas Arte Público' (Public art design competition) so art, design and architecture students perform an action to promote inclusion and social development in rural areas. In its first series, it has been carried out in collaboration with the Town Council of Ribera de Arriba, which will be in charge of the implementation of the winning projects.

TO THE ENVIRONMENT

The EDP Foundation has maintained its collaboration with the environmental organisation FAPAS (Fund for the Protection of Wild Animals), planting trees in areas of public use in Asturias. Likewise, it has collaborated with several anglers' associations in the restocking of Asturian rivers with indigenous species.

The 'EDP SOLIDARIA' programme is an initiative promoted by the EDP Foundation whose main goal is to help improve the quality of life of the people in the areas in which EDP carries out its activity, by supporting sustainable projects aimed at addressing the top priority social needs, fostering the improvement in the quality of life and the inclusion of the people and groups that are most vulnerable and at risk of exclusion, and promoting employment and entrepreneurship.

AREAS FOR ACTION

- Fostering of rural development and fight against depopulation of rural areas;
- · Care of elderly people's needs.

Since 2015, it has supported **121 projects in Spain**, to which it has allocated more than **3 million euros**, which have benefited **more than 200,000 persons**.

The exceptional situation of severe social, health care and economic crisis our country is going through as a consequence of COVID-19 has driven the EDP Foundation to launch in October the extraordinary EDP Solidaria COVID-19 initiative.

'Eficiencia energética y entorno adecuado para la reparación del daño, como Derecho de los Niños, Niñas y Adolescentes bajo tutela que residen en la Fundación Hogar de San José' (Energy efficiency and appropriate environment for damage repair, as a right of the boys, girls and teenagers in care who live in the Fundación Hogar de San José)

This project promotes an improvement in the residential homes of the boys, girls and teenagers in care in the entity. Its purpose is ensuring comfort conditions similar to those that are desirable for any family. This project aims to erect a new building that meets the best energy efficiency standards, for which EDP Solidaria was requested part of the investment required to achieve such standards.

'Transición y Eficiencia Energética, atención a personas con discapacidad y Educación Medioambiental en Centro Especial de Empleo Agroecológico' (Energy transition and efficiency, care of people with disabilities and environmental education in the Agri-food Employment Special Centre)

This project will undertake an action to improve the energy efficiency of the installation of the Agri-food Employment Special Centre, replacing the heating system with a more efficient one and the electricity supply system with a renewable energy self-consumption system. The project will allow a cost reduction and will improve the viability of the entity, at the same time that it will transmit an image more consistent with the agri-food production of the project on social inclusion and employability of people with disabilities, serving as model for others and becoming one additional element of a potential environmental education programme.

'RehabilitArte con Energía: rehabilitación energética y arte urbano en barrios vulnerables' (Energy renovation and urban art in vulnerable neighbourhoods)

The project envisages the energy renovation of a building fitted out for vulnerable families. Its main measure will be the installation of thermal insulation on the external faces of the façades, in combination with micro-efficiency measures in the inside and energy advice for families. This will considerably improve their energy efficiency and the thermal comfort inside it, reducing their energy bills and CO₂ emissions. Such insulation will serve as basis for an urban art participatory action on the façades, which will increase the visibility of energy action and contribute to a positive transformation of the environment, an improvement in social inclusion in the neighbourhood and a promotion of the feeling of ownership and belonging by fostering citizen participation throughout the entire process. It will implement energy advice points and energy and art workshops for all the neighbours, extending the action in the building to the entire neighbourhood.

For the implementation of the urban art action and the revitalisation actions related thereto, the entity has established a partnership with Asociación Asalto (www.asalto.org). It is an entity that designs, manages and produces projects, both in the urban and in the rural sphere, which use urban art as a tool for social transformation.

'Espacio de participación y transformación ciudadana basada en la eficiencia energética y en la economía circular' (Space for citizen participation and transformation based on energy efficiency and circular economy)

This is the second year of execution of a three-year project approved in the EDP Solidaria 2019 programme. It envisages the creation of a space for citizen participation and social transformation in one of the most vulnerable neighbourhoods in Zaragoza, applying energy efficiency, renewable energy and circular economy criteria. The year of execution will allow to conclude the restoration of the space; to strengthen the awareness and social transformation activities, using the space as a training tool; to train trainers in global citizenship and responsible consumption in the non-formal education sphere; to offer a space for groups from the neighbourhood and the city; and to work for the development of income-generating activities, using the potential of the space and applying business methodologies to contribute to the maintenance of the organisation's essential activities in defence of the right to health.

Project

'Hogares que merecen ser habitados' (Homes that deserve to be inhabited)

It aims to escalate the work performed in the project funded by EDP Solidaria in 2019, extending it to the entire Puente de Vallecas and taking it further. On this occasion, in addition to intervening in vulnerable homes to improve energy efficiency and their knowledge of energy matters, it proposes to create a district network of organisations to fight energy vulnerability, including the training of female workers in energy matters, the establishment of an energy desk in 4 entities to offer personalised advice and the intervention in 20 vulnerable homes, implementing electricity security and micro-efficiency measures, following the performance of an energy audit.

Project

'Mejora de la inclusión social por implantación de un sistema solar Fotovoltaico en el Centro Amigo de Cáritas en Triana' (Sevilla) (Improvement in social inclusion as a result of the implementation of a photovoltaic solar system in Centro Amigo de Cáritas in Triana)

It aims to install a set of solar panels on the roof of the Cáritas refuge for people at risk of exclusion in Triana, on a self-consumption basis, seeking a saving in the energy bill that will allow the release of resources to increase the number of beneficiaries and extend the support they are provided. The current annual consumption according to the electricity bills is 55,000 kWh. After having studied the usable surface on the roof, it is planned to install 20 solar panels of 400 Wat/u, which would involve a power of 8 kWp. The annual production expected with the panels will be 12,700 kWh, which would entail saving approximately \leq 2,000 per year during the useful life of the panels, that is between 25 and 30 years.

The hardest part of my work was listening to the extremely sensitive issues conveyed to us by the directors of the Association, aimed at foster children. It is shocking to see first-hand the problems they are confronted with.

Without a doubt, participating in EDP Solidaria is a unique experience that brings you so much on a personal level and makes you take up again values and reflect on topics about which we never stop to think, but which exist, making many people, including children, suffer; by doing our bit we will achieve a better world for them.'

This is the second year of execution of a three-year project approved in the EDP Solidaria 2019 programme. The goal of the project is to stimulate youth leadership both on a social and economic level, offering them a support network and tools to be able to revitalise and contribute to the development of their territories, while simultaneously creating the necessary conditions for them to remain therein. For this purpose, it works on the creation of a network of young people that promotes youth participation activities, offering them support and peer learning tools, and furthermore, it commits to the promotion and support of youth entrepreneurship, broadly speaking, both on a social and economic or mixed level, through different onsite and online actions that seek, above all, to create a public-private support network and to establish synergies among players.

This project seeks to increase the life opportunities of voung people aged between 14 and 18 in the south region of Almanzor, connecting their development and aspirations to the opportunities in their area. For this purpose, it will work on reducing the digital gap in the rural population, connecting young people from different autonomous regions with experiential educational content focused on their territory, in a blended learning exploratory journey. It will also improve the social and emotional abilities of young people aged between 14 and 18 with school dropout and lack of motivation problems, sparking their creative spirit, self-leadership and vocation as agents of change. Lastly, it will try to build a sustainable eco-system in the region, overcoming the usual barriers among autonomous regions, engaging key players of the territory: secondary schools, companies, professionals, social entities and volunteers.

The opening of a centre in Gijón responds to the beneficiaries' demand for a closer physical proximity and compatible schedules, both for the teenagers and their families, which in many cases have to juggle their attendance and their work activity. Likewise, this demand was reflected in the external assessment carried out by the University of Oviedo, which pointed out that opening centres in more localities would improve the coverage of the resource. Thus, for the recipients, EDP Foundation's support meant the possibility to access the programme, which entails being able to benefit from its results: reduction of the current and future development of addiction problems in underage and young people, improvement in the family dynamics and reduction of family conflicts, and acquisition of communication and coping resources for the family.'

'With the SMART CITIES project, we aimed to take one step further and integrate technology into these social impact projects, both in young people and in the community. This involved intensively working on the SDGs and on the innovative concept of Smart Cities, which builds interconnected efficient communities that guarantee the well-being and inclusion of all the people thereof; all this including a very powerful digital basis which was new for young people and involved a challenge for educators.

Thanks to EDP Solidaria's support, we have achieved to implement such digital basis in the social impact projects that our Foundation develops. We have realised that individual support, personalisation, training and community projects, on one side, and technology, on the other side, are not incompatible, but quite the opposite, supplementary and necessary for each other.

It is also relevant to highlight the impact as regards youth education adherence during the pandemic. None of the young people that was actively participating in the project in January dropped it out in the lockdown months. This speaks positively about the development of their own autonomy and, specifically, about skills such as self-regulation, growth mentality, empathy, etc. It should be noted that most of them were absentee students in the ordinary education system nine months earlier.'

'During 2020, we have also started supporting people and small companies in the rural areas of Asturias in their entrepreneurial process in order to provide them with tools. Both unemployed people and entrepreneurs and small companies have been supported throughout the year to start businesses, and they have received training in specific and cross-cutting matters related to circular economy. Thanks to the technical support, 18 people have received training and advice to carry out their business idea.

Out of the entire action, we would like to highlight the entrepreneur Cristina Secades Cicero, with her Kiwín Bio project. It is a sustainable agri-food project in an ecological farm for the production of baby kiwi and Asturian dessert apple. The abilities acquired and the self-confidence created enabled Cristina to sign up for the EWA initiative (Empowering Women in Agrifood), in which she was selected, along with 9 other projects, as the best ones in the entire Spanish territory.

Generating opportunities in the rural environment, especially affected by the depopulation phenomenon, can settle population in the territory and foster the return of people to the rural areas, giving these territories a new opportunity.'

'The support of the EDP Foundation has meant, first of all, an incentive and the recognition of a project relatively new in the entity, which pushes us to maintain our determination to foster and promote it further. Since its beginning, we have been committed to the therapeutical benefits brought by artistic expression and, particularly for this project – music – to the minors and adults we support in the social organisation. This is why, in the second place, it has also involved the possibility to continue the performed work based on the planned project, both as regards the payment of the salaries of the professionals developing it as well as minor expenses – material and technical – required for its execution.

As for the impact in 2020, it must be taken into special consideration the start of the state of alert dated on 13 March and the pandemic situation on a global level, which, as one would expect, deeply affected the development of this activity and the remaining activities performed by the organisation. This pandemic situation involved the forced restriction of the actions that were not classified as essential activities.

Despite this scenario, and also because of it, the performed activities entailed a strengthened creative and emotional support to the minors and adults that were affected by the lockdown situation and the social restrictions, creating a space for catharsis and psychological well-being.'

ENERGÍA SOLIDARIA

It is a programme that seeks to promote energy efficiency and sustainability through different initiatives, engaging the different business areas of EDP and its volunteer employees.

The main goal of Energía Solidaria is to increase the safety, well-being and energy efficiency of the most vulnerable families identified by Cáritas and Cruz Roja, by analysing the energy situation of their households and performing activities aimed at reducing their energy bill and changing their consumption habits. The activities include, among others, the implementation of energy measures in dwellings, as well as training in efficient energy consumption habits, which will allow families to make a sustainable use of energy in accordance with their financial resources.

Energía Solidaria has the same goals as regards the installations of non-profit organisations, carrying out activities parallel to those performed with families, with the aim of improving the energy and economic sustainability of such installations.

As a consequence of the situation generated by COVID-19, during year 2020, EDP's volunteers have not been able to conduct their usual visits to the households of the vulnerable families, although the actions for improvement detected in previous visits have been carried out in the dwellings and centres specified by Cruz Roja and Caritas, thus benefiting 18 families, 6 centres and more than 1,800 people.

Also in 2020, the EDP Foundation joined the pilot experience of the first renewable and solidarity '<u>Barrio Solar</u>' (Solar Neighbourhood) in Spain, which will be installed in Zaragoza. In addition to the technical audits, the processing of energy certificates, the technical inspections or the replacement of basic equipment (such as LED, radiators, boilers, etc.), the 'Barrio Solar' Office will be created in order to carry out different environmental and energy awareness, education and advice initiatives, which will be open to all the neighbours.

Since 2015, the EDP Foundation has supported 331 families and 69 centres, to which it has allocated a total of 780,500 euros, thus benefiting more than 70,000 people and engaging more than 139 volunteers from EDP.

EDP FOUNDATION ACADEMY

It is aimed at contributing to strengthen the organisational capabilities of partner companies in order to reinforce their social impact and at contributing to fulfil the global goal of the EDP Solidaria programme. This initiative is a clear example of how the EDP Foundation tries to offer all the social entities, regardless of their size, the opportunities and tools required to improve their operation, impact and efficiency.

In 2020, due to COVID-19, the academy opened to entities registered at the Asociación Española de Fundaciones (Spanish Association of Foundations) and all the sessions became telematic. 70 entities attended a total of 11 fully free training sessions, such as Social Innovation, Preparation of Projects with an Impact, Impact Measurement, Sustainable Finances or Financial Management focused on NGOs.

Since 2019, the Academy has reached 102 entities and engaged around 900 attendees from Asturias, Galicia, Aragon, the Basque Country, Madrid, Cantabria and Andalusia, with 27 sessions.



'PUNTOS RESPONSABLES'

It is a fully free programme that rewards EDP customers with a number of points obtained in different ways: for each kWh of gas or electricity consumed, for associating new contracts, for each year of membership in the programme, for participating in EDP initiatives, etc. The accumulated points can be exchanged for gifts or donated for the implementation of solidarity projects through different NGOs. These are the so-called 'Puntos Responsables' (Responsible Points).

During 2020, EDP customers contributed 46,243,000 Responsible Points. The EDP Foundation contributed an equal amount of additional points, as a result of which the equivalent economic amount totalled €92,486. The entities that benefited from this programme were: **Comedores Sociales, Cruz Roja, Cocina Económica, Plantación árboles, Fundación Síndrome Down, DYA, Fundación Oso, Teléfono de la Esperanza** and **Energía Sin Fronteras**.

'ORDENADORES SOLIDARIOS'

Through this initiative, every worker can opt to purchase their own computer equipment (personal computer and peripherals) when it is time to withdraw them and they are not going to be used any more. The worker will acquire the computer equipment by paying a certain amount according to the type of computer, which the EDP Foundation will donate to the nonprofit organisation chosen by the employee. In 2020, €7,590 have been raised and 161 computers have been donated to different entities.

Since its launch in July 2014, €104,387 have been raised and 1,528 pieces of computer equipment have been donated.

As a consequence of the pandemic, most of the charity sports events were suspended. However, we collaborated with two virtual events organised by the Spanish Association Against Cancer (AECC) and the Sports Association Monte Areo, which achieved to raise €3,300 to support children with cancer.

MARTÍN GONZÁLEZ DEL VALLE 2019-2020 WORK PLACEMENTS

The work placement programme of the EDP Foundation allows many young people to supplement their university education through remunerated work placements at different EDP offices, in order that they can acquire skills that will help them to make their way through an increasingly complex and competitive labour market which is getting increasingly hard for the youth to enter. Plus, they not only acquire technical skills and experience in a work environment, but they also receive training in key topics related to sustainable development and corporate responsible behaviour, gathered in the different policies of the company, such as the quality or environmental policies.

This year, a total of 152 trainees from 10 Spanish universities have joined our programme, open to students from more than 30 specialities from different colleges and faculties, including postgraduate studies. Due to the pandemic, the experience was carried out by telematic means. Likewise, a laptop was provided to every trainee so they were able to take the placement online and have access to the company applications.

Since its implementation, more than 100 people who participated in the programme have joined the staff of the EDP Group in Spain.

WHAT DO OUR TRAINEES SAY?

Erik Fandiño Hernández

Bachelor's Degree in Business Management and Administration I EDP department: Business Intelligence and Big Data

'On my first day, right after arriving at EDP, I had a host of feelings. On the one hand, I was happy for the opportunity they were giving me to work with them, but, on the other hand, I was a little scared, since it was my first work placement and I did not know whether I would be up to it or meet the expectations of my position.

This fear quickly disappeared; my co-workers were always willing to help me with any problem or doubt that may come up and they still do that at present, so the improvement is continuous.

Over this time, I have learnt to perform a great variety of tasks in this department, among which I could highlight learning how to handle the SAS Guide, Information Map Studio or Olap Cube Studio tools, in addition to others for different purposes.

Through the performance of this work placement, I hope to acquire further knowledge about these tools, others tools and their purposes, and teamwork but, most of all, to better cope in the student and labour spheres thanks to everything we have been learning and still are.'

'VIVA NUESTRA ENERGÍA'

The education programme 'Viva Nuestra Energía' (Long live our energy) has been bringing boys and girls closer to key concepts related to energy and sustainability for more than 11 years.

Even though 'Viva Nuestra Energía' started out as a group of face-to-face workshops in order to help children to better understand the world and the environment and to become aware and responsible consumers, the challenge for year 2020 has been adapting the programme to the situation caused by COVID-19, promoting the renewable energy message beyond a specific physical environment.

To this end, 'Viva Nuestra Energía' has been transformed into a didactic multilingual digital platform (Web + APP), which allows schoolchildren aged between 6 and 16 (Primary and Secondary stages) to use it on a local or remote basis on a national level, thus extending the initial geographical range to which the programme was limited.

'Viva Nuestra Energía' has put at the disposal of students and teachers 'La Gran Aventura' (The Great Adventure): the discovery of energies through avatars that allow the interaction of all the participants, including online games, weekly tests and challenges that have a major motivating effect on students. During the first half of 2020, it reached 4,086 boys and girls from 41 schools, thanks to agreements with the different Regional Departments of Education, which have made it possible to integrate the contents of the programme into the primary education curriculum.

Since October 2020, the digital platform has been used approximately by 9,000 students from different areas of the country, and it has even been tentatively used in other countries. Up to December 2020, 15 chapters have been added to 'La Gran Aventura', in addition to 50 resources for different subjects, fun video experiments and a classroom management application for teachers.

The main goals of the application will be promoting teamwork among students and online/offline work in these times of uncertainty, so that, not only it moves forward towards a more sustainable and avant-garde future, but it will also help teachers in the digitisation of the classroom.

2020 Initiatives

VISITS TO EDP PREMISES

It is a programme to visit EDP's thermal and hydraulic power plants, where it is possible to get to know first-hand how electricity is generated and the best practices in the management of these installations.

As a consequence of the pandemic, visits had to be cancelled for most of the year, but yet 704 people (students and groups) have visited us and discovered the secrets of our hydraulic and thermal power plants.

GREEN EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS



DESIGN COMPETITION 'ARTE PÚBLICO' (PUBLIC ART)

It is a competition for art, design and architecture students, with domicile in Spain, aimed at supporting them in the execution of a joint artistic and applied architectural design action, following the programme specified by the panel and chaired by Joaquín Vaquero Ibáñez.


It is a public-private innovative action that seeks to impact on the improvement in social inclusion in the community and to foster local development in the rural areas, by using art applied to the environment. Art is used as a social transformation tool that goes beyond the borders of the municipality, building an environment of innovation and social value.

In this first series, in collaboration with the Town Council of Ribera de Arriba, 122 applications were received, with a total of 177 people interested, which were finally reduced to 33 proposals, with a total of 59 participants from 20 Spanish universities.

The panel, comprised by a cross-cutting expert team, with an interdisciplinary profile and perfectly aligned with the defended values, decided, in addition to award the best idea of each line, to grant a recognition to two additional ideas in view of their quality.

EXHIBITION OF PABLO PICASSO'S Engraving

The Centro Niemeyer launched three series highlighting the prime of creation, the command of the different techniques and the variety of themes that make the graphic work of Pablo Picasso one of the most important artistic testimonies of the 20th century. This exhibition displayed *Suite Vollard*, started by Pablo Picasso in 1930 and considered one of the peak works of the master from Málaga. It also presented the full series *Les Cavaliers d'Ombre* (1954) illustrating the book by Geneviève Laporte, comprised by poems written between 1951 and 1953. *El entierro del Conde de Orgaz* is another creation by Picasso that could be admired on this occasion. It was a series of thirteen engravings edited on 25 October 1969, a date that coincides with the anniversary of the birth of the author.

The EDP Foundation supported the launch of a pilot project: a multimedia channel aimed at becoming an online benchmark for poetry, both national and international. In short, it consists in communicating poetry through multiple disciplines and formats, working for this purpose around a podcast channel and the live streaming of activities.

The development of the Madrid Poetry Festival for 10 years has allowed POEMAD to be provided with multimedia material propitious for spreading the voices that comprise the current poetry corpus, and which will be seized through the multimedia channel subject of this project. The POEMAD activities have been broadcasted from the Centro Cultural Conde Duque, Casa América, the Residencia de Estudiantes, the Instituto Cervantes and the Centro Cultural de China en Madrid, from the month of October 2020, and they will last until February 2021.

Art and Energy Efficiency

MUSEO NACIONAL CENTRO De Arte Reina Sofía

In 2020, the EDP Foundation entered into an agreement with Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofía for the development of a project on the lighting of the Collection Rooms dedicated to the work *Guernica* and its historic context. The project consists in the replacement of the existing conventional lights by LED lights, notably improving the energy efficiency of the installation. The reached agreement also provides that the monetary value of the energy savings resulted for the Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofía may be allocated to implement social actions within the scope of the Museum's purposes and competences.

This agreement follows the collaboration path started by the Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofía and the EDP Foundation in 2019, with the lighting project for the interior of the Palacio de Cristal in the Parque de El Retiro, in Madrid.

RESTORATION OF THE SAN PEDRO DE LA RIERA CHURCH (SOMIEDO)

We collaborated in the restoration of the church in San Pedro de La Riera, dating from the 18th century, with a Latin-cross plan, a vault and a bell tower, in which several works were executed: restoration of the roof, involving the replacement of most of the tiles, but respecting the traditional shape thereof; restoration and painting of the walls affected by dampness; renovation of the belfry vault, following the instructions of the technical report of the Oviedo Archbishopric; and partial renewal of the electricity system.

INGUNA (INDUSTRY, CULTURE AND NATURE)

It is a non-profit industrial archaeology association, of public and social use, that groups citizens, professional groups and experts interested in the defence, conservation and enhancement of industrial, cultural and natural heritage.

The EDP Foundation funded the 22nd International Industrial Heritage Congress with the theme 'Towards a New Deal for Industrial Heritage'.

MUSICAL FORTNIGHT Donostia-san sebastián

This is a musical event held in San Sebastián every month of August since 1939. It has become the oldest music festival in Spain and one of the oldest in Europe. It offers more than one hundred concerts and shows scattered all around the city.

The EDP Foundation sponsored this Musical Fortnight, standing out, among other concerts, the *Coriolan Overture*, *Heroic Symphony no. 3*, performed by Euskadido Orkestra and conducted by Semyon Bychkow, to commemorate the 250th anniversary of Beethoven's birth.

This year, it has relied on national performers due to the restrictions caused by COVID-19.

CÍRCULO CULTURAL Valdediós

Non-profit secular cultural association founded in 1998, aimed at the promotion and spreading of culture. It is rooted and based in the Santa María de Valdediós Monastery in Villaviciosa, Asturias, a medieval construction erected around San Salvador de Valdediós, 'el Conventín' (the little convent), one of the Asturian pre-Romanesque jewels. The Monastery is a place of withdrawal, tourism and pilgrimage, which offers guesthouse services.

The Chamber Music Concert Cycle was held on 25 July and 1, 8, 15 and 22 August, under the name 'Atardeceres musicales' (Musical evenings), with which the EDP Foundation collaborated.

FUNDACIÓN ÓPERA DE OVIEDO

The EDP Foundation is one of the top sponsors of the Fundación Ópera de Oviedo (Oviedo Opera Foundation), an entity whose main purpose is holding concerts and activities related to the opera, including the organisation of the annual opera season in the Teatro Campoamor in Oviedo. The significance of this artistic activity involves, in addition to a cultural event not to be missed, an economic boost to the city, since different sectors benefit from it for several months.

LA CASTALIA

The 19th singing and vocal repertoire Course on the Voice on Chamber Music of the association La Castalia, sponsored by the EDP Foundation, was held in the month of December in Oviedo and included a workshop on lyrical performance in order to give students practical and real experience in dramatic performance. As a consequence of the pandemic, the closing concert had to be moved to February 2021.

'SUENA LA CÚPULA'

It is a cycle of nine chamber concerts that were organised in the dome of Centro Niemeyer, in Avilés. The concerts were held one Sunday a month, in the morning, with a limited capacity, due to the constraints caused by the pandemic.







OTHER COLLABORATIONS

TRIBUNA CIUDADANA

It is a cultural association founded in 1980 that fosters the development of science and culture in their broadest and most varied facets, through the promotion and performance of all kind of activities aimed at the study, development and spreading of scientific and cultural topics. The EDP Foundation collaborated in the cycle named 'PORTUGAL Y ASTURIAS. LAZOS Y ABRAZOS' (Portugal and Asturias. Ties and embraces) , whose purpose was studying the bond between Asturias and Portugal and their historical, artistic and cultural ties. Some of its activities had to be moved to 2021, as a consequence of the pandemic restrictions.

CHILDREN'S COMPETITION 'LA EVOLUCIÓN DEL HOMBRE'

The EDP Foundation sponsored the children's drawing competition 'La Evolución del hombre' (The evolution of man), aimed at Primary Education students in the school centres of the region, related to the 'Humanos' (Humans) exhibition about the evolution of man, organised by the newspaper *La Nueva España*.

In order to participate in the competition, the students had to produce their drawings on a DIN A4 sheet and take a brief test containing questions related to the exhibition.

CONTEMPORARY ART ASSOCIATION ALNORTE

The EDP Foundation collaborated this year again in the 19th Contemporary Art Week of Asturias, which was held between 1 and 30 October in different Asturian localities. It is a generational meeting that includes exhibitions, grants, seminars, presentations, round tables, meetings, debates, courses and workshops in various sections.

'PEGADOS A LA TIERRA'

The EDP Foundation collaborated in the sponsorship of a series of features published by the newspaper El Comercio, under the title 'Pegados a la tierra' (Stuck to the land), whose goal was to be a portrait of the emptied Asturias, inviting its readers to reflect on the region, which is almost in an endemic crisis, but which can have and must have a promising future.

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BASQUE LANGUAGE FIESTA IN THE BASQUE COUNTRY

Ikastolas (schools, in Basque) fiesta in support of the Basque culture and the Basque language, including a concert held in the Kursaal Palace on 13 November, in which local artists performed. This concert was recorded and broadcasted on the Basque public television.



ENVIRONMENTAL

PLANTING For biodiversity

This almost veteran programme is carried out with the collaboration of the environmentalist organisation FAPAS (Fund for the Protection of Wild Animals) and seeks to increase the forest area in an eco-friendly way, contributing to protect biodiversity, in addition to producing fruits to feed the fauna in the area.

In 2020, 8,600 trees were planted in Asturias in areas of public use, specifically in Ribadedeva, in the councils of Ribadedeva and Ribera de Arriba and in the University of Oviedo Campus in Gijón. The action in Ribadedeva was supplemented by a programme through which the eucalyptuses of the forest were removed and used in turn as fertiliser to repopulate the land with indigenous vegetation. In the University Campus, the goal is to foster the formation of a significant leafy forest mass, also boosting biological diversity, since many of these species produce fruits, thus contributing to feed squirrels and other animals. The trees were planted in Ribera de Arriba in an



attempt to create a wet forest strip that serves as firewall for the municipal mount. For this purpose, it was a very closed birch plantation, which will allow to generate sufficient dampness to prevent fire from entering the forest mass.

Since its start in 2009, more than 140,000 trees have been planted in different areas of Asturias.

2020 Initiatives

FISH RESTOCKING

In 2020, not only the forests, but also the Asturian rivers benefited from the restocking with indigenous species thanks to the collaboration of the EDP Foundation with the Asociación de Pescadores y Amigos del Nalón (Association of Fishers and Friends of the Nalón River), the Real Asociación Asturiana de Pesca fluvial (Asturian Royal Association of Fluvial Fishing) and the Asociación de Pescadores Fuentes del Narcea (Fuentes del Narcea Association of Fishers).

On this occasion, the activities that are organised every year with schoolchildren from the areas could not be carried out due to the pandemic restrictions.

ASTURIAS BEAR FOUNDATION (FOA)

It is a private non-profit entity whose purpose is the promotion and development of activities aimed at the conservation of the Cantabrian brown bear and its habitat.

The EDP Foundation collaborated in the project on environmental reporters in Protected Natural Areas. Thus, three environmental reporters worked between 1 July and 15 September in different areas of the Las Ubiñas-La Mesa and Somiedo nature reserves and their vicinity, with the aim of promoting the preservation and protection of those protected natural areas, specifically the habitat of the Cantabrian brown bear in Asturias, as well as environmental awareness and education.

FUNDACIÓN PATRIMONIO NATURAL DE CASTILLA Y LEÓN

It is a foundation linked to the Castile and Leon Regional Government which seeks to promote, maintain and manage the natural heritage of the Castile and Leon region. The EDP Foundation and EDP Renovables have been collaborating since 2014 to carry out several environmental actions aimed at the conservation of the red kite and which, in 2020, materialised in the following:

- Repair of red kite transmitters purchased in previous campaigns and recovered on the field.
- · Acquisition of 6 new transmitters and re-attachment of devices to 10 chicks in their nests.
- · Actions to track the breeding population of red kite in the provinces of Salamanca and Zamora.
- Location and tracking of the breeding population of red kite in the province of Salamanca.
- Tracking of the breeding population in the region of Sayago (Zamora).

 Editing, layout and printing of the monograph about the red kite.

REHABILITATION GROUP FOR NATIVE FAIINA AND ITS HABITAT (GREFA)

It is a non-government non-profit organisation which was founded in 1981 as an association for the study and conservation of nature. The EDP Foundation and EDP Renovables collaborate to develop the following projects that have been executed throughout 2020:

- Sponsorship of two specimens of black vulture, classified as a species at risk of extinction, within the conservation programme 'Proyecto Monachus'.
- Assessment of the impact of the waste treatment plant located in the area of the wind farms Altos del Voltoya on the black vulture and red kite populations.
- Correction of an overhead line situated in the area of the wind farms Altos del Voltoya which was successfully completed last month of August. It was a line that, despite not being linked to EDPR infrastructures, was a source of accidents for birds, due to its proximity to a waste treatment plant which was a usual route for birds from their home ranges to their feeding areas, and because it was not fitted out with appropriate security measures against electrocution and collision. In total, action has been taken on 11 dangerous supports and 35 state-of-the-art bird diverters have been installed.

MEASURES AGAINST COVID-19

The EDP Foundation implemented several measures and collaborated with different initiatives during the health care crisis with the aim of contributing to solve and reduce the impact caused by the pandemic. These have been the main collaborations:

- With the regional Government of Asturias, to provide sanitising gel to different essential service workers: police, security services and external public health care workers.
- With the Fundación María Cristina Masaveu Peterson and the Fundación Cajastur, to give all the Asturian citizens free access to the contents on their website for a month.
- With the campaigns of the newspapers La Nueva España ['Asturianos en Casa, a favor de quedarse en casa'] and El Comercio ['Saldremos juntos Asturias, información sobe el decálogo contra el coronavirus'].
- With the Fundación Banco de Alimentos de Asturias, to address the needs of many families, especially those who have lost their jobs.



- With the IMOMA (Asturias Institute for Oncological and Molecular Medicine), funding the studies the IMOMA may conduct in connection with the analysis on individuals potentially infected by virus SARS-CoV-2, for the ultimate purpose of contributing to determine genetic factors that influence the susceptibility of people to the infection by this virus.
- With Cáritas, other NGOs and residential homes in Asturias, for the donation of PPE for the most vulnerable people.
- With the Regional Department of Education of the Principality of Asturias, for the purpose of reducing the

digital gap for the most vulnerable families, by funding laptops and thus enabling access to education.

- This initiative, carried out jointly with other companies, was recognised with the 'Premio iTIC Empresa' award, an 'Impulso TIC' initiative that seeks to help and promote technological creation in Asturias.
- With the Asociación de Fundaciones de España, letting their members access the EDP Foundation Academy.
- With the NGO Sed, since, despite the cancellation of the summer camps, EDPR has managed the collaboration

with such entity for the care of minors and families in a vulnerable situation or at risk of social exclusion faced with the situation created by COVID. The support has been based on three lines of action: covering basic needs, psychological support and social support.

- With i4case e Innovación EDP, supporting a smart system connected to the telephone through an App that provides clear reference values to monitor patients that are isolated in their homes due to COVID-19 (85%), and that also alerts them and/or health care workers of a dangerous situation that requires hospitalisation. The project has a clear innovation goal, since it expects to define the parameters that govern the healthiness of the air inside people's homes, to estimate the correlation between environmental variables and vital parameters provided by i4case, and to obtain additional information from the processing of the data obtained from the sensorization of people and dwellings/offices in order to establish the environmental conditioning needs.
- With the non-profit association CANVIDA DETECCIÓN, contributing to respond to the crisis caused by the global pandemic, supporting a dog unit for the detection of COVID-19; it is an initiative aimed at detecting people infected by COVID-19, especially those asymptomatic, in transit areas or in crowded environments. The project, which will be initially executed in Asturias, is framed within a broader programme that involves professionals from different fields (health care, university, staff from the Dog Rescue Unit of the Principality of Asturias, etc.), for the purpose of using dogs' ability to smell in order to detect diseases. Its impact may be especially relevant to limit the expansion of COVID-19 and for the gradual return – under safety conditions – of the population to sports and cultural events.
- With EDP Solidaria COVID-19: an extraordinary initiative restricted to the entities selected in previous series of EDP Solidaria (2015-2020) to help entities meet the expenses of the actions carried out in 2020 to respond to the crisis generated by the pandemic.
