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ABOUT THE REPORT

We close 2019 with the satisfaction of having managed to maintain the EDP Foundation's commitment to our four priority areas for action: education, culture, society and the environment – on this occasion, with a working approach that combines commitment to local issues with the prospect of contributing to sustainable development in the framework of the global agenda:

- WE HAVE STRENGTHENED OUR COMMITMENT TO EDUCATION AND FIRST-TIME EMPLOYEES. Within the educational area, we should highlight our commitment to promoting the responsible use of energy in schools through the ¡Viva nuestra Energía!!¡Tu Energía! (Long live our Energy!) programme, which reached more than 8,700 students in 179 educational institutions. Also of note in this area are educational grants for vulnerable families and grants for first-time work experience, an initiative that aims to facilitate access to employment for young students.
- WE HAVE MAINTAINED OUR COMMITMENT TO CULTURE. During year 2019, we continued to support opera seasons and symphony concerts, without forgetting the organisation of activities such as conferences and exhibitions, thus facilitating access to culture for thousands of people.
- Partnerships with institutions as relevant as the Princess of Asturias Foundation or the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao, as well as
 other renowned entities, should be highlighted.
- WE HAVE CONTINUED TO SUPPORT OUR FORESTS AND RIVERS. As regards the environmental area, more than 9,000 trees were planted and we collaborated on environmental awareness and recovery activities, among which those aimed at restocking fish in Asturian rivers especially stand out.
- THE EDP FOUNDATION, NEXT TO PEOPLE. In the social area, we collaborated with various non-profit organisations, contributing an amount of €73.270, thanks to the participation of EDP customers in the 'Puntos Responsables' (Responsible Points) programme.
- Our programme of direct support to social projects, EDP Solidaria (EDP Solidarity), offered financial support to 18 projects worth €600,000 and the Energía Solidaria (Solidarity Energy) programme managed to help 52 vulnerable families and 19 centres of social organisations in Asturias, the Basque Country, Cantabria, Galicia, Andalusia and Madrid.
- Attention should be also drawn to the launch of the EDP Foundation Academy, whose purpose is to help to strengthen the
 organisational skills of partner entities in order to reinforce their social impact and help to attain EDP Solidaria programme's
 overall goal, and which was attended by 190 people from 32 entities.

In all these activities, described in this report and available on the website www.fundacionedp.es, volunteers and partners of the EDP Foundation played an essential role. Thank you for everything

Message from the General Director

VANDA MARTINS

It has been already a year since I sat before a blank page and tried to gather on it what had been a 2018 full of challenges and today, almost without noticing it, the time has come again to sit before a piece of paper in order to share with all of you everything the year we are now closing has brought us. It is astonishing how fast time flies, especially, when you spend it doing what you love.

2019 has been a fascinating year. While 2018 was the year of #MeToo and the popularisation of feminism, 2019 has been the year in which climate has managed to make its way to the centre of the public debate. All of a sudden, the concern over environmental degradation and the consequences it entails have become a topic of conversation in households, restaurants and the political arena.

Little by little, we have become more aware that the problems we are facing as a society require global solutions, and that these solutions involve the commitment and actions of governments, citizens and companies, without exception.

The decisions we make every day as citizens, as consumers, are able to generate changes that will help to build such sustainable future – the only possible one. And companies, as corporate citizens themselves, also have the responsibility to adapt their practices and strategies in their different fields of operation.

In this sense, the energy sector plays a key role when it comes to facing the global climate change challenge and thus, it must engage in significant investments and make a firm commitment to reduce CO2 emissions into the atmosphere. EDP has a distinguished track record in sustainability but, aware of the urgency of change, it has set itself new challenges with which it wants to lead the transition to a new energy model based on decarbonisation, sustainability and the involvement of stakeholders.

In this framework, the EDP Foundation launched in 2019 its new strategy 2019-2021, including the challenge to consolidate its alignment with the global strategy of the Group while, at the same time, maintaining its commitments on an education, social, cultural and environmental level.

In order to achieve this, we devised a strategy based on three fundamental cornerstones:

Firstly, boosting the current aid and initiatives. Aware of the importance of the assumed commitments, the established alliances and the impact of our work on a local level, we have opted to maintain our programmes and partnerships in our four traditional areas for action (education, society, culture and environment), but implementing actions for improvement and optimisation, which will allow us to achieve a greater impact and introduce, little by little, innovation elements.

Secondly, progressing towards alignment with the Group's goals. As we have seen, the company is facing major challenges, and the Foundation can play a key role in meeting them. For this reason, the gradual modifications we are introducing in our programmes and partnerships are oriented towards such alignment, but always allowing the entities and groups with which we work to adapt. An example of this work has been the establishment of 3 priority areas within the 2019 EDP Solidaria programme (elderly care, fight against depopulation and access to energy), but keeping the possibility of maintaining our support for projects against exclusion on a temporary basis.



The best example of this approach has been the launch, in 2019, of the 'Academia Fundación EDP' (EDP Foundation Academy), an innovative programme in which volunteers and external experts participate and which has offered organisational development training and opportunities to entities with which the Foundation already had a partnership, thanks to EDP Solidaria.

In short, 2019 has been a year in which we have strengthened our commitment to a more sustainable world in the framework of Agenda 2030, and in which we have started to take firm steps towards those goals, hand in hand with entities, customers, partners and, of course, volunteers, since nothing in this report would have been possible without their work and dedication.



NUMBER OF UNIVERSITY TRAINEES TAKING THEIR WORK PLACEMENT AT EDP




SCHOOL VISITS TO EDP PREMISES (No. of students)


PLANTING FOR BIODIVERSITY (No. of planted trees)



The Mission of an organisation reflects what it is, what it does; the Vision expresses what it wants to become.



EXCELLENCE

The EDP Foundation's grant programme allows, every year, around 200 trainees to take remunerated work placements at the different EDP offices, contributing to the excellence of their training as a previous step to their entry into the labour market.

INITIATIVE

The EDP Foundation promotes the EDP Solidaria initiative aimed at improving the quality of life and facilitating the inclusion of the most vulnerable people, supporting projects intended to tackle the most urgent needs of our society. It also promotes the Energía Solidaria programme, which aims to increase the safety, wellbeing and energy efficiency of the most vulnerable families and social entities, implementing energy efficiency measures and providing training in consumption habits.

TRUST

The EDP Foundation supports symphony concerts and opera seasons and organises activities such as conferences and exhibitions, facilitating access to culture for thousands of people.

SUSTAINABILITY

'Planting for biodiversity'.

This programme seeks to increase the forest area in an eco-friendly way, helping to protect biodiversity and to produce fruits that will feed the fauna of the area. EDP Foundation's collaboration on the restocking of rivers is further proof of this commitment to the environment and biodiversity.

INNOVATION

The participation of volunteers from the different business areas of the company in the various initiatives promoted by the EDP Foundation strengthens the caring spirit of the staff, allowing to diversify the activities and facilitating their development.

TO EDUCATION AND RESEARCH

The EDP Foundation has entered into agreements with several universities, both Spanish and foreign, which have allowed 179 students thereof to take remunerated work placements at the different offices of EDP throughout 2019.

TO CULTURE

EDP is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao, an emblematic third-millennium building, associated with contemporaneity, technology, avant-garde and design concepts.


Likewise, the EDP Foundation is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Princess of Asturias Foundation, an institution that grants every year awards aimed at recognising scientific and technical, cultural, social and humane work carried out by individuals, work teams or institutions at an international level.

TO THE ENVIRONMENT

In 2019, the EDP Foundation's commitment to the environment made it possible to plant 9,300 trees in the municipality of Ribadedeva and in the university campus of Gijón, in Asturias.

TO SOCIETY

The EDP Foundation participates in the 'Responsible Points' programme. In this programme, customers donate the points they obtain from their energy consumption to charity projects promoted by different NGOs, and the Foundation donates an equivalent amount.

I have participated in several series of EDP Solidaria and every year they are new experiences; on this occasion, as a Manager of IPE (Identidad para Ellos y Ellas), an association that works with young people formerly guarded by the public administration.

In the project supported by EDP Solidaria, two flats were made available so that boys and girls from the association could live autonomously. These girls were absolutely thrilled to inaugurate their flat and start their new life, but the flats were empty. Aside from the EDP Foundation, I asked my friends for help and we all gathered what we already had at home: electrical appliances, furniture, lining, household items, etc. — in a couple of days the flat was fitted out and it looked beautiful, as a result of which they could inaugurate it ahead of schedule.

5.1. EDUCATION AND RESEARCH

5.1.1. 179 TRAINEES IN EDP TO TAKE WORK PLACEMENTS

"...Being able to access the EDP Foundation work placements has been the most enriching experience of my university education."

If we are sure about something in the EDP Foundation is that education is the cornerstone on which the future rests; the youth of today will have to make their way through a more complex world which will require trained people in order to face major challenges. We need to provide them with tools to achieve this. The Sustainable Development Goal number 4, focused on education, establishes as one of the priority goals "...substantially increase the number of youth and adults who have relevant skills, including technical and vocational skills, for employment, decent jobs and entrepreneurship".

In this framework, our work placement programme acquires, if possible, more significance, since it allows many young university students to supplement their university education through remunerated work placements at different EDP offices, in order that they can acquire skills that will help them to create a niche for themselves in an increasingly complex and competitive labour market which is getting increasingly hard for the youth to enter. Plus, they not only acquire technical skills and experience in a work environment, but they also receive training in key topics related to sustainable development and corporate responsible behaviour, gathered in the different policies of the company, such as the quality or environmental policies.

In 2019, a total of 179 trainees from different Spanish universities have joined our programme, open to students from more than 30 specialities from different colleges and faculties, including postgraduate studies.

5.1.2. STARTINNOVA, REWARD FOR ENTREPRENEURIAL SPIRIT

Young people are full of ideas and enthusiasm for carrying them out. These ideas can be the key not only to their future, but to major changes that will allow us to build a more just and sustainable society.

We believe in the potential of these ideas and thus, in 2019, the EDP Foundation has supported the seventh series of the STARTinnova programme, an initiative by 'El Comercio' newspaper aimed at promoting entrepreneurial culture among young upper secondary and/or Vocational Training students.



The STARTinnova programme is based on an e-learning platform via which the students develop business projects that are presented to a panel of experts from the University of Oviedo

200 students from 16 centres throughout Asturias have participated in this seventh series.



5.1.3. SCHOOL PROGRAMME 'VIVA NUESTRA ENERGÍA'

The education programme 'Viva Nuestra Energía' (Long Live Our Energy) has been bringing school children closer to key concepts related to energy and sustainability for several years, helping them to better understand the world around them and become aware and responsible consumers.

In 2019, 'Viva Nuestra Energía' reached 8,716 boys and girls from 72 schools in Asturias, the Basque Country and Navarre, thanks to agreements with the different Regional Departments of Education, which have made it possible to introduce the contents of the programme into the primary education curriculum.

5.1.4. FORO COMUNICACIÓN Y ESCUELA

Our commitment to the territory is reflected in our maintained partnerships which, year after year, allow us to contribute to the development of the communities in our surroundings, many of which are facing major challenges related to imbalances between rural and urban life.

An example of this commitment is our partnership, since 2009, with the 'Foro Comunicación y Escuela' of the Secondary Education School Elis y Luis Villamil; an initiative aimed at supplementing the education received by students by using communication as a cross-cutting element in the activities, with the goal of breaking the isolation of young people in rural areas, bearing in mind that school is the best tool to eliminate inequalities.


5.1.5. VISITS TO EDP PREMISES

5.1.6. FUNDACIÓN DE INVESTIGACIÓN E INNOVACIÓN BIOSANITARIA DE ASTURIAS (FINBA)

Biomedical research is essential for the creation of new medicines and for the early diagnosis of diseases and their treatment. The FINBA (Asturias Foundation for Biomedical Research and Innovation) was launched in 2014 with the hope of contributing significant breakthroughs in biomedical research. In order to improve the research work, new premises have been inaugurated in the old Psychiatric Hospital building, next to the Hospital Universitario de Asturias (HUCA). This has been possible thanks to the collaboration of 13 companies, entities and public and private institutions, including the EDP Foundation.





5.1.7. CONFERENCE ON NANOPARTICLES – WOMEN IN SCIENCE

The 10th International Conference on Magnetic Nanoparticles was held in the exhibition site of Gijón between 27 and 31 May 2019, and was attended by almost 200 professionals.

In the framework of this conference, the EDP Foundation supported the event 'Inspiring Women in Science: Yes, we nano!', held on 28 May in the Palacio de Congresos of Gijón. The purpose of this event was spreading the role of scientific women, eradicating stereotypes and inspiring new generations to increase the presence of women in science.

5.1.8. DIPC – DONOSTIA INTERNATIONAL PHYSICS CENTER

Scientific research is a fundamental pillar of society's development; this is why one of our commitments as a Foundation is supporting innovation and research through different actions and alliances, such as the ones we maintain with the Donostia International Physics Center, of whose Board of Trustees we are members.

The Donostia International Physics Center is a leading centre in scientific research; it carries out research in the field of Basic and Applied Physics in areas of interests for the Basque society and for international scientific development. This centre is also open to partnerships with other technology centres, universities and companies.

Thanks to the support of the EDP Foundation, the Donostia International Physics Center has been able to conduct nanoscience research obtaining results that have an international impact.

Furthermore, the EDP Foundation attended this year the meeting held in the Kutxa Science Museum, in which a group of upper secondary students had the opportunity to chat with three top level researchers; the Nobel Prize Sauvage, Jocelyn Bell and Ignacio Cirac.





5.1.9. INTERNATIONAL INTERNSHIP FAIR

Our commitment to quality education leads us to support supplementary training, and we firmly go for work placements as a springboard for young people to enter the labour market.

An example of this commitment was our participation in the 3rd International Internship Fair, which was held on 24 October in the Deusto Business School campus in San Sebastián, in which 26 multinational companies and around 250 students participated.





5.1.10. GREEN EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS

It has been already 7 years since the Green Education programme was born to help reduce inequalities in the education sphere due to socio-economic reasons. It is a scholarship programme targeted at schoolchildren and university students who get good marks and have scarce financial resources. The amount of the education grants can be ≤ 500 , $\leq 1,000$ or $\leq 3,000$, depending on the year the student is taking.

During year 2019, the Green Education scholarships facilitated access to education for 53 students in the localities of Vejer de la Frontera (Cádiz), Ponteceso, Zas and Santa Comba (La Coruña) with a total invested sum of 48,500 euros.



The presentation ceremony of the projects was held on 14 November 2019 in the Laboral Centro de Arte, in Gijón, in an event which was attended by, in addition to the chairman of the EDP Foundation, Manuel Menéndez, Rui Teixeira, CEO of EDP España, members of the Board of Trustees of the EDP Foundation, and representatives from the 18 selected associations, as well as top representatives from EDP España and EDP Renováveis, volunteers and managers of the different projects.





ENERGÍA SOLIDARIA


Energía Solidaria is a programme that seeks to increase the safety, wellbeing and energy efficiency of the most vulnerable households and the non-profit organisations with which the EDP Foundation collaborates.

This programme is an example of networking, and it would not be possible without the participation of Cáritas and Cruz Roja, as well as without the involvement of the different EDP's business areas and their volunteers.

Its main purpose is to analyse the energy situation of the vulnerable families identified by Cáritas and Cruz Roja and of the selected participating entities, and carry out activities aimed at reducing their energy bill and changing their consumption habits by:

- Implementing energy efficiency measures in their dwellings and centres.
- Providing training in efficient energy use habits which will allow the families and the centres to make a sustainable use of energy in accordance with their financial resources.

EDP FOUNDATION ACADEMY

INAUGURATION

The EDP Foundation Academy was inaugurated on 28 March 2019 in Oviedo by the CEO of EDP España, Rui Teixeira, and the Director of the EDP Foundation, Vanda Martins, in an event in which the Regional Minister of Social Services and Rights, Pilar Valera, and the General Director for Academic Planning and Education Innovation, Francisco Laviana, participated.







GOAL OF THE PROGRAMME

The main goal of the EDP Foundation Academy is to help to strengthen the organisational skills of partner entities in order to reinforce their social impact and contribute to the achievement of the overall goal of the EDP Solidaria programme.

BENEFICIARIES

In this project, all the beneficiary entities from any of the EDP Solidaria series have had the opportunity to participate. It sought that these entities were capable of improving their organisational development and acquired key abilities in matters that helped them to meet their identified needs and improve their impact and sustainability.

ORGANISATION AND APPROACH. STAGES OF THE PROGRAMME

The EDP Foundation Academy combined different methodologies (intensive training and support) organised in 3 stages:


DIAGNOSIS	It allowed identifying the priority areas to work on and the needs of each and every organisation, in order to define a training and support plan adapted thereto.
TRAINING	Face-to-face training in Oviedo, with the launch of the Academy on 28 March 2019.
TRAINING	Face-to-face training with the possibility of online attendance (between April and June 2019) through an in-house platform in which entities were provided support and learning tools.
TUTORIALS	Application of the acquired knowledge, including personalised support adapted to each case by a professional selected based on the profile of each entity. An individualised road map was jointly designed, which helped each organisation to move forward in the improvement process.

MENTORING FOR 5 SELECTED ENTITIES

Out of all the participating organisations, the EDP Foundation selected five entities to participate in the last stage, in which experts offered them individualised mentoring between June and September 2019.

NO. OF ATTENDEES

190 people from 32 entities attended the different courses, either onsite or on streaming.





VOLUNTEERS

The EDP people received training to be able to share their knowledge with the participating organisations.

5.3.2. VOLUNTEERING

Volunteering is one of the practices that contribute the most to the development of the community: those who volunteer make our environment a better place to live in and, furthermore, they develop new social, personal and professional skills and abilities.

All the companies of the Group have volunteering programmes that are in line with the strategic goals of the company and which help us to build a more sustainable future.

'ORDENADORES SOLIDARIOS'

The 'Ordenadores Solidarios' (Solidarity Computers) initiative started in July 2014 and EDP España and EDP Renovables participate in it.

The people working at EDP can purchase their own computer equipment when it comes the time to withdraw it. The EDP Foundation donates the money obtained from that purchase to the charity chosen by the own employee. Plus, the computer equipment withdrawn in perfect condition is repaired and fitted out to be donated to non-profit organisations.

As a result of this initiative, in 2019, €22,350 were collected and 197 computers were donated to different entities. Since its launch in 2014, €131,000 have been collected and 1.377 pieces of computer equipment have been donated.

PART OF US IN CHRISTMAS

The goal of EDPR's 2019 Christmas Campaign was to put smiles on the faces of people at risk of social exclusion.

On the one hand, employees donated gifts for children, managing to collect more than 298. Per each collected gift, EDPR made a donation which was used to support an elderly person in a situation of social risk.

Furthermore, different initiatives were developed in which EDP's employees participated: 6th Tournament of Solidarity Paddle, 2nd Solidarity Football 7 Mini-league, 'Ventas Solidarias' (Solidarity Sales), 'Llegan los Reyes Magos (The Three Magic Kings are coming), 'Bolsas Solidarias' (Solidarity Bags), 'Manos a la obra' (Get to work) or the 'Aceite Solidario' (Solidarity Oil) project.

Thanks to these initiatives, €9,000 were raised, which were donated to different NGOs to contribute to the funding of their solidarity projects.

ENVIRONMENTAL VOLUNTEERING

Conservation and recovery of unique natural areas is one of the priority lines of work of the EDP Foundation.

In November 2019, EDPR held an environmental volunteering event in Oviedo, Seville, Madrid and Zaragoza, in which a total of 41 employees had the opportunity to participate in forestry tasks in collaboration with the organisations FAPAS, ECOHERENCIA, REFORESTA and FONDO NATURAL, all of which are engaged in environmental protection.

OTHER VOLUNTEERING ACTIONS



DIARIO VASCO CHARITY CONCERT

Our commitment to culture is one of the hallmarks of the EDP Foundation, and the support and recognition of music as an essential part of culture is one of the key cornerstones of our actions in this area.

On 19 December 2019, the charity Christmas Concert was held at the Conference Centre and Auditorium Kursaal in San Sebastián, supported by the EDP Foundation; the takings were donated to the Fundación Aspanogi (Gipuzkoa Association of Parents of Children with Cancer).



CRUZ ROJA CHRISTMAS CAMPAIGN

Each Christmas, there are hundreds of families without sufficient resources as to give their children gifts in good condition. This year 2019, the EDP Foundation supported the campaign 'Sus Derechos en Juego' (Their play rights at stake), whose purpose was the collection of new gifts to be handed to children in a situation of vulnerability.

The employees in the offices of Bilbao managed to collect 6,444 toys, far exceeding the campaign's goal, which was 6,000.





AYUDA EN ACCIÓN - 'ACORDES CON SOLIDARIDAD'

The EDP Foundation supported the charity concert held at the Teatro Real in Madrid on 28 May. This concert is framed in the programme 'Acordes con Solidaridad' (Solidarity Chords), developed by the NGO Ayuda en Acción, which aims to generate equal opportunities based on the values offered by music. Plus, this year involved the participation of a choir comprised by children from the



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schools Ramiro Solans and Joaquín Costa in Zaragoza. The takings of the concert were donated to the programme 'Aquí también' (Here too), supporting the most vulnerable families in Spain and also promoted by Ayuda en Acción.

SUMMER CAMPS OF THE SED FOUNDATION

Summer camps are amazing experiences for children and they also offer the opportunity to develop key abilities and skills to their development. In 2019, the EDP Foundation sponsored the summer camps of the SED organisation, which took place in July and were attended by 71 boys and girls in two series according to the age of the minors:

- MINI urban camp: 37 boys and girls aged between 3 and 9 enjoyed entertainment activities, workshops, excursions and swimming pool days.
- MAXI sleepaway camp: 34 boys and girls aged between 10 and 15 lived together for five days in the premises of the Hoces del Durantón lodging in San Pedro de Gaillos (Segovia), enjoying its natural surroundings.

'PUNTOS RESPONSABLES'

The programme 'Puntos Responsables' (Responsible Points) is a fully free programme that rewards EDP customers with a number of points obtained in different ways: for each kWh of gas or electricity consumed, for associating new contracts, for each year of membership in the programme, for participating in EDP initiatives, etc.

The accumulated points can be exchanged for gifts or donated for the implementation of solidarity projects through different NGOs. These are the so-called Responsible Points.

During 2019, EDP customers contributed 16,440,000 Responsible Points. The EDP Foundation contributed an equal amount of additional points, as a result of which the equivalent economic amount totalled €73,270.

The WOPatos (rubber ducks) race is followed by a series of different family-friendly activities.


The EDP Foundation funded part of a WOPatón with the tickets bought by employees to support the WOP Foundation.





BUSTI ZAITEZ 22ND SERIES

People with chronic diseases face serious difficulties to lead a healthy and happy life. Aware of this tough reality, the EDP Foundation collaborated in 2019 with the Fundación Vasca Esclerosis Múltiple (Basque Foundation for Multiple Sclerosis) on its campaign 'Mójate Busti Zaitez', which consists in having a charity swim in the closest swimming pool or beach to raise funds that will be used to support people who suffer from multiple sclerosis. This is the 22nd year this campaign is organised and it was held on 14 July.



5.3.3. SPORTS EVENTS AND OTHER POPULAR EVENTS

CASA JUNTAS DE GERNIKA CHARITY MARATHON

On 30 December, a charity marathon was held at La Casa de Juntas de Gernika for the purpose of raising funds for charity organisations such as Aunar Taper Solidario or the Club Atletismo adaptado, among others, managing to collect €9,000.

In this marathon, supported by the EDP Foundation, the athletes Javi Conde and Jon Salvador participated for the sixth time.

It should be highlighted the participation for the first time of the runner and journalist Begoña Beristain in order to bring to light the role of women in sports.

Thanks to this charity marathon, the raised funds reached €9,000.



7TH MARCHA GREEN

The EDP Foundation collaborated on the 'Marcha Green' (Green Walk); a leisure march bringing together sports, health and family. Thanks to this beautiful charity walk through the routes of Vitoria's green belt, funds were raised and fully donated to Cáritas Álava.



7TH CARRERA FAMILIAR DE GETXO

The 'Carrera Solidaria Familiar de Getxo' (Getxo Charity Fun Run) is organised every year in the Marina of this locality and is sponsored by the EDP Foundation.

It is a race for the general public involving a 1.5-km distance. Up to three generations can participate by applying for group registration, and it can be completed up to a maximum of five times. The funds raised this year 2019 were donated to Retina Bizkaia Begisare (Association of People Affected by Hereditary Retinal Dystrophies).



IST CARRERA INTERGENERACIONAL OVIDA

The EDP Foundation collaborated this year 2019 on the Ist 'Carrera Intergeneracional OVIDA', an intergenerational charity fun run in which €2,375 were raised and donated to the Déjame tus piernas (Lend me your legs) association, whose mission is the promotion of sports activities and the inclusion of people with disabilities.

The fun run was held on 12 May in Oviedo and attended by participants of all ages and physical conditions.



IST CARRERA GALBÁN

In 2019, the Asociación Galbán organised its first charity fun run to raise funds to fight against childhood cancer. The fun run, supported by the EDP Foundation, was held on 17 February simultaneously in 16 Asturian councils involving distances from 2 to 5 km.

7TH CARRERA FAMILIAR DE BILBAO

In 2019, the EDP Foundation offered again its collaboration on the 7th 'Carrera Familiar de Bilbao' (Bilbao Family Fun Run). It is a leisure event for the general public which combines sports, health and family. It starts in the open area of the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao, runs to the Maritime Museum and then comes back to the starting point.

The funds raised this year were donated to AFA-BIZKAIA (Bizkaia Association of Families of People suffering from Alzheimer and other Dementias).



CHARITY FUN RUN IN SUPPORT OF PROYDE PROEGA

The PROYDE PROEGA Foundation (belonging to the network of La Salle NGDOs in Spain and Portugal) organised this year a charity fun run in partnership with the EDP Foundation with the aim of raising funds to contribute to the decrease of child and teen pregnancies through preventive action in the educational sphere. The funds raised totalled €2,127, which were fully donated to this solidarity project carried out in the framework of the National Plan for Pregnancy Prevention in the San Marcos and Quiché Departments in Guatemala.





BUSCANDO SONRISAS

'Buscando Sonrisas' (Searching for Smiles) is a charity trail that was held last 29 June in Santander, sponsored by the EDP Foundation. The raised amount of €25,340 was donated to the 2nd Humanisation Stage of the paediatric emergency areas of the Hospital Universitario Marqués de Valdecilla in Santander.



CHARITY SWIMMING CROSSING

The Desafía Dravet association is a non-profit organisation that seeks to help to improve the quality of life of children affected by the Dravet syndrome and related diseases, as well as to promote research projects to find a cure for this epileptic syndrome. In 2019, Desafía Dravet organised a charity swimming crossing at the marina of Getxo, supported by the EDP Foundation, which raised a total of €5,700.





ASPANOVAS CHALLENGE

The triathlete from Bilbao, Edu Zapata, ran 100 km last 7 September around the Hospital Universitario de Cruces, in Barakaldo, a centre in which Aspanovas Bizkaia (Bizkaia Association for Children with Cancer) carries out its daily activity.

The EDP Foundation sponsored this race, in which Edu Zapata set out to raise awareness about the situation and the needs of children and adolescents suffering from cancer, and it managed to collect €10,000 for Aspanovas.





'ASTE NAGUSIA'

'Aste Nagusia' is the big fiesta of the city of Bilbao, also known as 'Semana Grande' (Great Week). It is held every year for 9 days in August, always ending on 15 August. In the corresponding fiesta of 2019, the EDP Foundation sponsored the Txu-Txu train that shuttles between Plaza del Gas (theatre) and Parque Doña Casilda, joining the main areas where the children and family activities are carried out.





BASQUE FESTIVAL

Further proof of the importance the EDP Foundation gives to education and culture can be found in its support to the Ikastolas fiesta, which is held every year in June; this year, in the localities of Vitoria (Araba), Lekeitio (Bizkaia) and Zarautz (Gipuzkoa).



5.3.4. AWARDING OF PREMIO TULIPÁN DE ORO

The EDP Foundation was awarded the 2019 Tulipán de Oro prize granted by the Asociación Párkinson de Asturias (Asturias Parkinson Association) last month of April. This association has wanted to recognise the sensitivity shown by the EDP Foundation supporting and promoting initiatives that improve the quality of life of the people affected by the disease, as well as its efforts to reduce inequalities and progress towards the creation of a more just, equal and socially responsible society. The award ceremony had special significance, since it was held coinciding with the commemoration of the World Parkinson's Day.



Entities' Testimonials

At the beginning of 2020, a survey was conducted of the Entities selected in EDP Solidaria 2018 which had carried out their project during 2019, containing the following questions:

- What has EDP Solidaria's support meant to the entity and/or the project?
- Which was the impact of the project on the life of the beneficiaries? Is there any significant case?
- Which other benefits do you think the project has contributed?

Some of the answers received are gathered below.

CÁRITAS DIOCESANA DE BILBAO

Project: 'HERRIZ – HERRI' (Town by town).

The EDP Foundation gave Cáritas the chance to start its 'Diuntasuna Ereiten' project on social gardens in Gordexola with 20 direct beneficiaries. Subsequently, it was transformed into the 'Prelaboral Soloan' workshop and a social organic farming company, biozaki, which aspires to maintain itself on the agri-food market and qualify as social and labour inclusion company. The Fundación EDP has supported this process by providing the resources to make the investments that have materialised in the Soloan and biozaki projects.

The impact of this project has been high both for the people hired by the farming company, as they were all unemployed and two of them were in a situation of vulnerability, and for the workshop staff, since it has involved an introduction to organic farming as a labour option. Furthermore, two of them took paid work experience at the company.

Biozaki also participates in local events, fairs and markets and farming structures of the area. In addition to promoting the generational replacement in the industry, it takes care of the land, guaranteeing sustainable production, it participates in initiatives aimed at promoting the production and consumption of healthy food, and it builds a valuable legacy for the generations to come.

ASOCIACIÓN CUANTAYÁ

Project: 'SALTO. Acompañamiento socioeducativo para la Transición a la Vida Adulta' (SALTO. Socio-educational support for the transition to adult life)

The support of the EDP Foundation was the boost for setting up a Project which the Entity had been considering necessary for a while in order to give an articulated response to a group of the population for which there are not many support offers in a period of vital importance such as the transition to Adult Life.

The impact of this project has been positive, as it is gathered from the assessment of the participants, most of which continue in it, as well as from the assessment of their personal processes.

It was also significant the integration into training pathways of three young people who, at the time of joining the project, were dissociated from such training and labour pathways. Plus, thanks to this project, we have been able to offer a stable space for study and support, tutorials, guidance and monitoring and promotion of additional training. Their abilities to face a first contact with the labour world, as well as to foster their personal and social growth and become active and committed citizens, have been enhanced.

We deem that the implementation of this project helps to increase the opportunities for a group of young people, some of who are in situations of social vulnerability.

IDENTIDAD PARA ELLOS

Project: Proyecto Dédalo (Daedalus Project)

Thanks to the support received by the EDP Foundation, we have increased the income of the entity, which is why we were able to take care of more young people and thus meet the growing demand for the Administration's intervention and resources and the number of boys and girls that leave the protection system. Furthermore, we set up a second supervised flat for young people, which has allowed them to make their situation stable in the medium or long term and us to hire a further professional.

The impact this project has had includes: an increased number of cases taken care of and put in stable housing, thus reducing the number of formerly State-guarded young people through a more personalised intervention thanks to the hiring of a new expert; the improvement in their social inclusion and employability with the signing of work contracts and training courses; the meeting of their basic needs; the improvement in their self-esteem and self-concept; and the creation of a network for support, healthy leisure and reduction of drug use.

Other benefits that should be highlighted are awareness among society of this group, the public administration's knowledge of the entity's resources in order to continue protecting young people once they reach the majority of age, the reduction

of young people on the street and, as a consequence, the reduction of drug use and delinquency.

ASOCIACIÓN CATÓLICA INTERNACIONAL SERVICIO JUVENT

Project: 'IN VIA DIGITAL'

Our employment guidance work targets mainly immigrant women who have arrived at our country searching for a better life, and who view household and care employment as an occupational option. Additionally, they are not familiarised with the new technologies and they do not have equipment. The support of the EDP Foundation has allowed us to fit out a classroom for digital training and put at the users' disposal computer equipment to help them find a job.

This project has allowed job seekers to improve their skills in new technologies in order to increase their possibilities of success in their employability, helping to reduce the pay gap. It has allowed them to create a CV and a Gmail account, to interact on the main job searching platforms, to manage their applications at the INAEM and to learn the basic online procedures as regards the Administration.

The project has become part of the activities offered by the entity within the employment guidance programme. Its implementation has allowed us to become aware of the difficulties some people face when using new technologies in their job-seeking process, reducing their possibilities of employability and increasing the digital gap. Internet is here to improve our life, which is why it is essential that all people have access to it, since, otherwise, it involves an inequality. This project has allowed people who do not own computer equipment or are not trained to use it to access new technologies.

RELIGIOSAS DE JESÚS-MARÍA

Project: 'Invertir en la primera infancia es invertir en el futuro' (Investing in early childhood is investing in the future)

For our school 'Escuela Infantil Jesús-María' located in Pinos Puente (Granada), the support received from the EDP Foundation has meant a major progress in the education quality we offer our students. It involved a significant challenge, because we were not used to this kind of projects, and it has also been a great satisfaction

Thanks to what we have carried out, we have been able to considerably reduce the number of accidents in the playground and increase the psychomotor development in our students aged from 0 to 6.

The project has given us experience and opened the door to a relationship with the EDP Foundation. We must be very grateful for the attention we have received, which has been wonderful; we are delighted and very grateful for everything, for the natural, friendly and humane treatment and the interest in our work. Thank you from the bottom of our hearts.

ASOCIACIÓN ASPERGER MADRID

Project: 'Intervención en contextos naturales para personas con síndrome de Asperger y/o TEA' (Intervention in natural contexts for people with Asperger's and/or ASD)

The EDP Foundation's support for this project has involved an impetus to the possibility of starting the support service in natural contexts thanks to the economic boost, the possibility of meeting the current needs of the children and youth population with autism spectrum disorders (ASD), and the opportunity to meet other entities and their support strategies, from which we can learn and enrich ourselves from their experience.

The impact of this project on the life of the participating families is that their quality of life has improved. 'Talking about quality of family life is not often easy, since it alludes to wellbeing, even happiness, in a particularly complex context, with singularly significant human relationships that involve the deep – and sometimes unknown – core of every person and shape the framework from which we approach other relationships and situations. Family is one of the most important contexts for everyone, and who knows whether even more so for those with intellectual disability, since they are going to spend more time with their family than others and are going to be recurrently supported thereby' (Verdugo, 2004)

Awareness has been raised among the family environments. The families of all the users have been included in the aware environments, as well as the education institutions with which we have had a sustained partnership over time and other community contexts in which support has been provided.

A service with a new intervention approach has been created and consolidated in the Asociación Asperger Madrid. The project has had an impact on our own organisation, helping us to strengthen our family-centred focus, both regarding professionals and the rest of families of the entity.

Once started the project, we have detected the families' need for support. In addition to providing it to the parents of children with ASD, we have also met requests regarding siblings or members of the extended family who have usual contact with the kid. Likewise, those professionals with whom we have maintained a sustained collaboration over time have been also indirect beneficiaries.

Lastly, the indirect beneficiaries have included: siblings, grandparents, usual professional caregivers, other professionals

supporting the kid (tutors, counsellors, therapeutic pedagogy teachers).

ASOCIACIÓN CULTURAL LA KALLE

Project: 'La FABLAB-TEKA Laboratorio de Fabricación Digital' (FABLAB-TEKA, Digital Manufacturing Laboratory)

In view of the key role currently played by technologies in our lives, increasingly present and, in turn, creating a wider gap for people in a situation of vulnerability, it has been a great opportunity for La Asociación Cultural La Kalle to be able to develop an innovative project, getting ahead of what the emerging market of technologies is introducing in new market niches and traditional trades.

Having EDP Solidaria's support has helped us to consolidate the 'Fablabteka' project, allowing our young people to have access to training and tools, through which they can acquire new abilities that would be difficult for them to acquire otherwise.

For the beneficiaries, in addition to a training resource, it has become a reference space in which they can continue their personal and professional development, with the innovation, creation and social dimension of the project, leading and working on projects such as 'Laboratorio ciudadano' (Citizen laboratory).

A further benefit contributed by the project is the recognition and interest in knowing the Fablabteka shown by other entities, both public and private.

The Fablabteka has become a benchmark where we can develop community projects, involving the transformation of 4.0 carpentry, in which words such as prototyped, collaborative and Open Source have acquired a big ethical dimension.

APOSTÓLICAS CJ – COMUNIDAD DE OBRAS SOCIALES

Project: 'Caja de herramientas: Mírame soy visible' (Toolbox: Look at me, I am visible)

Being able to reach the municipalities of the region has allowed us to raise awareness among a great number of inhabitants of rural areas and small towns about the problems of gender-based violence on elderly women. Likewise, it has allowed elderly women who had remained silent to speak up about gender-based violence situations and ask for help.

The project has had, in our opinion, a very positive impact in general terms, both on the population in general and on the professionals of the towns that have participated in the different activities proposed by the Caja de Herramientas. There are several towns interested in starting to work with

elderly women over 60. Likewise, we believe that it has had a very positive impact on the women participating in the photo exhibition, this being an activity that has enabled them to find themselves and create a new network for them. Their feedback on what has meant to them being part of the exhibition opens the door to a new way of carrying out actions in which they play the leading role.

It has managed to bring to light the problem of gender-based violence on elderly women beyond the Autonomous Region of Madrid, through different media exposure and participation in sessions and meetings held in different parts of the country.

ASOCIACIÓN PARKINSON ASTURIAS

Project: 'Escuela de Parkinson Asturias' (Asturias Parkinson School)

For the association, the fact of having the financial support of the EDP Foundation has encouraged us to set up a new project in which we did not have any kind of previous experience.

We have not achieved the goals set in the beginning, due to, in addition to our lack of experience in this kind of projects, other causes such as the failure to meet the deadlines by the contracted company, the lack of social media use by the target group and the change of professionals, but the intention of the entity is to go ahead with the project, since we have observed that the beneficiary people appreciate it.

For the beneficiaries, both diagnosed people and their families, the project has involved a better knowledge of the disease and understanding of the importance of treating the symptoms with rehabilitation therapies, all of which is translated into an improved handling of the disease in its entire development process.

In the case of health professionals that accessed the platform, it has been observed that they have appreciated, in addition to the provided information, a better understanding of the work carried out by the association with the Parkinson group.

FUNDACIÓN CEPSA – PROYECTO HOMBRE DE ASTUIAS

Project: 'Apoyo a la inserción laboral de personas adictas en rehabilitación' (Support for the employability of recovering addicts)

The Project brought the possibility to start the 'Reciella' Programme for minors, youth and families in Gijón. The Fundación C.E.S.P.A. had been trying it for years due to the demand that was being received in such locality. This year, the opportunity of being assigned appropriate premises for the programme has combined with EDP Foundation's support, which allowed us to fit them out and furnish them. Therefore.

the EDP support was key to the starting of the project, thus meeting the needs detected in the citizens of Gijón.

The impact on the people's life has materialised in the improvement in their quality of life and their social and educational inclusion and employability. By decreasing drug use in these children and young people and changing their behaviour patterns and habits, their health will improve and both family problems and those derived from studies, job searching, etc. will be diminished. Likewise, we will see to the legal situation of those minors and young people who come to the programme with any judicial measure, preventing these situations from happening again and favouring an appropriate citizen participation. On the other hand, from the point of view of the families, their personal situation will also improve by enhancing communication, reducing the conflict rate and increasing their ability to handle daily-life situations with the minors and young people. Most of the cared people are already in the process of making these changes.

Other benefits of having the project in Gijón have to do with the access to the programme by the people living in Gijón or its surroundings, who previously had to go to Oviedo, which involves saving money and reducing travelling time, a better family-professional life balance, etc. – situations that were posed by the families as accessibility difficulties.

On the other hand, from the point of view of a better adaptation to the target group of the programme, having a centre of their own, separate from other addiction programmes which the Foundation has, also facilitates access to the resource, removing resistance from the children and young people, who do not often identify their problems with substances.

FUNDACIÓN AYUDA EN ACCIÓN

Project: 'STEPS: pasos para la inclusión de la infancia vulnerable' (STEPS: Steps for the inclusion of vulnerable children)

We have been able to contribute to the improvement in the education communities in which STEPS has been carried out and to involve the community in the work performed by Ayuda en Acción in the region of Madrid, through a reading-encouraging activity with volunteers related to the project, in addition to keep improving our impact-measuring and assessment tools hand in hand with the team of EDP Solidaria.

Likewise, it has allowed to equip 7 low-resources education centres in the districts of Tetuán and Latina with additional tools and activities that allow them to offer their students bigger opportunities, break down negative stereotypes within the community and foster the decrease of the absenteeism and dropout rate of their students.

FUNDACIÓN SILOÉ

Project: 'Aula de Música de la Fundación SILOÉ' (Music classroom of the SILOÉ Foundation)

The support of EDP Solidaria has involved the development and promotion of an intervention space that combines three essential aspects: art, education and therapy – the 'Aula de Música' (Music classroom) – and the chance to develop musical therapeutic activities and, for that purpose, specifically, to fit out the physical space, equip the activity with instruments and accessories and pay teachers' fees, all of which were necessary matters to execute the project.

The impact of the activity has been very positive (and still is, since at the Fundación Siloé, we have opted for its continuity). The improvements have taken place in the three aspects designed in the project: learning and technique in strictly instrumental and/ or vocal skills, social interaction among groups and acquisition of caring behaviours with group work methodology, and emotional regulation, enhancement of the frustration threshold and optimisation of self-esteem, from the psychological approach.

The three mentioned areas are a comprehensive improvement area which has been boosted by participation in public musical and vocal activities in indoor and outdoor spaces.

We would like to thank EDP Solidaria for their support in helping us develop an activity we deem essential for the education, social and psychological improvement in the children and adults we take care of.

ASOCIACIÓN AMIGOS CONTRA LA DROGA

Project: 'Programa de tratamiento para personas con problemas de bebida -PPB- en régimen de centro de día' (Programme for treating people with drinking problems in a day-care centre)

The support of the EDP Foundation has contributed to the maintenance and diversification of the services provided at the ACDA Addiction Treatment Centre. Specifically, we have implemented the comprehensive care Programme for people with drinking problems, from which 22 people benefited in 2019, and which has obtained excellent results. Plus, the support of the EDP Foundation has contributed to the fact that other entities took an interest in the project and financially supported it as well, such as the case of the Fundación Cajastur-Liberbank.

It has been noticed a significant reduction in alcohol

consumption and in the drinking-related problems of beneficiaries, in addition to a marked improvement in the psychological and psychiatric unease symptoms measured through standardised questionnaires.

The Project has been consolidated as a service to which other resources, such as Mental Health Centres or Social Services, can refer people who require comprehensive support and

intensive treatment.

Thanks to the collaboration of EDP (which has prepared the project and contributed the materials and the equipment) and the Avilés Town Council (which has been in charge of the installation), we can finally have an efficient heating system for the Centre, which has extremely improved the quality of life of the users and the staff. The heating system was set up in October and it has managed that, for the first time,

no one is cold in the winter since we moved into these premises in year 1996.

Project: 'CapAAPcítate. Formación en nuevas tecnologías accesibles para personas con baja visión y discapacidad visual' (CapAAPcítate. Training in new technologies accessible for people with reduced vision and visual impairment)

The support of the EDP Foundation has meant being able to develop activities for the improvement in the autonomy of people with visual impairment which we could not have provided otherwise, also generating audio visual material that allows to replicate the training actions even when the project has concluded. As a result of this project, we have launched new digital support projects for training people with visual impairment.

We could say that thanks to this project, the quality of life of people with such disability has improved, mainly as regards autonomy and social relationships.

Furthermore, thanks to the fact that we obtained public funding because we already counted on funding by a private entity such as the EDP Foundation, we have been able to extend the support to other entities. Thank you very much!

FUNDACIÓN TOMILLO

Project: 'Regeneración Urbana: Propuesta sostenible de empleo' (Urban regeneration: Sustainable employment proposal)

Thanks to EDP Solidaria's support, we have helped people who live in unprivileged districts, identified by the Madrid Town Council in its Municipal Plan as Priority Areas for Boosting Urban Regeneration (APIRU), to go through a social transformation process in order to improve their life conditions, through awareness, empowerment and the development of interventions in their dwellings. Likewise, it has been useful for the entity to generate even more synergies with the other two entities that have participated in the project (Fundación Ressa and Fundación Santa María la Real del Patrimonio Histórico).

The Project has raised awareness and encouraged participants to improve their environmental awareness towards sustainability. The participants have become a lever for social change, being the

heroes of their own development process, actively participating therein and finding solutions to common problems, Thanks to our direct intervention in local communities, we have identified cases in which we have managed to optimised their bills, obtaining a pretty significant annual saving.

Plus, it has allowed to reinforce networking and alliances among different agents that are focused on a common cause: the improvement in the abilities and the quality of life of disadvantaged people through regeneration and sustainability in their immediate environment

ASOCIACIÓN ASTURIANA DE ESCLEROSIS MÚLTIPLE

Project: 'Rehabilitación virtual. Nuevos horizontes para la autonomía en la Esclerosis Múltiple' (Virtual rehabilitation. New autonomy horizons in multiple sclerosis)

The support of the EDP Foundation has brought the materialisation of the project. In AADEM, our maximum priority is to offer rehabilitation therapies and, although we are aware of the technology breakthroughs that offer an alternative therapy, also promoting other aspects such as motivation — a leisure component that improves results —, our efforts are focused on the professionals. This kind of support gives us the chance to keep us updated on new rehabilitation methods and benefit from new technologies breakthroughs.

The beneficiaries have benefited from a new, entertaining and effective rehabilitation method, since it requires higher doses of attention and concentration. The benefits of the therapy act on the health of the affected people, improving it, and give them a higher level of autonomy.

It is true that this impact is long term and depends on the characteristics of each user and the progression of the disease, but we could talk about a more immediate impact, which is the motivation and the mood displayed during the therapy.

Furthermore, it has helped to maintain the younger affected people in the therapies. Many times, the affected young people leave the services a few weeks later, usually due to problems when it comes to recognise their disease.

However, since the beginning of the year, we have not recorded any recently diagnosed young person leaving.

AFANIAS, A. PRO PERSONAS DISCAPACIDAD INTELECTUAL

Project: 'Entre Nosotras' (Among us)

The support of EDP Solidaria has allowed us to bring to light the situation of women with disabilities inside and outside the Entity, it has consolidated an Area, and it has created a unique space in the Region of Madrid to which women can resort for anything they need.

EDP Solidaria has allowed to develop a project that continues over time, not only because it is necessary, but because the women participating in it would not let this space disappear.

Spreading the Project among different public and private entities has managed that many women with intellectual disability who were alone and without references joined it; by participating in the project and mingling with other women with different or similar life stories, they have created natural networks of support, favouring their sense of belonging and mutual support. Furthermore, we should highlight the joining of a woman victim of gender-based violence, without any social network or family relationship, who has found in the project a place for being listened and supported. The project has also received women that, due to not having the length of residence required to apply for a public resource, have accessed the project and are currently in it.

The recognition of the Women Area and the work it carries out and the spreading of the 'Entre Nosotras' project funded by EDP Solidaria has managed that entities outside the Region of Madrid contact us to share our project with them, such as on 9 March, when we participated in the 'Mujer y Discriminación Múltiple' (Women and multiple discrimination) conference, organised by the centre for women in the Valdepeñas Town Council.

I would like to thank EDP Solidaria for giving us the chance to set up the 'Entre Nosotras: Un espacio de mujeres para mujeres con discapacidad intelectual' (Among us: a female space for women with intellectual disability) project.

Without your support, this so needed and dreamed of project would have never come true.

Furthermore, it has allowed us to learn from an entity such as the EDP Foundation, both regarding the execution of the project and the access to the Academy, through which we, the Amis professionals, have kept ourselves updated on the latest techniques and strategies, being able to implement all the improvements in our daily work and thus offering better care.

Project: 'Programa de responsabilización del delito y reparación del daño en Sistema Penitenciario' (Programme for crime accountability and damage repair in the penitentiary system)

CONCAES (Spain Penitentiary Fraternity) made an effort to get the support of the EDP Foundation, obtaining a fully positive outcome; firstly, as regards the support for our 'Justicia Restaurativa' (Restorative Justice) project, which has been established within the penitentiary context of our country and which has acquired continuity; secondly, concerning the support for sustainability and energy saving in our headquarters; and thirdly, regarding the two training projects in which we have been able to participate, with great value for our association growth.

The 'Diálogos Restaurativos' (Restorative Dialogues) project started as a dream to introduce Restorative Justice within the Spanish penitentiary system in a feasible and effective way, which reach a high number of convicted people. The boost derived from the EDP Foundation's support for the two associations that set it up, AMPC and CONCAES, was determining. Today, around 1,500 people have directly benefited by participating in the programme, and each of them has worked for 3 months on understanding the damage cause by their criminal action, on taking responsibility for their actions beyond any excuse, on working on repairing such damage and on restoring within possible the situation their action created. In addition to these 1,500 beneficiaries, there is a much higher number of indirect beneficiaries, such as their families and their communities, which have seen how these people have changed and many of them have converted to peace culture.

For all this, from CONCAES, we would like to thank you from the bottom of our hearts for the support we have received from the first moment from EDP Solidaria, as well as for the personal treatment we have received.

Project: 'Programa educativo para la integración de la migración Casa Común' (Education programme for the integration of migrants)

For our entity, having had the support to build the 'Casa Común' (Shared Home) Awareness Classroom and to hire staff to execute the project has meant a significant boost to the awareness goals we want to be present in our projects – a goal which was usually hard to design and execute since we had to see to the most urgent daily needs, but the support of

the EDP Foundation has made us stop to reflect on our way of working with the groups we take care of, highlight what we want to transmit to society with our work and materialise it through different activities we have designed to address matters such as migration and ecology with groups of all ages: from six-year students to the general public who have received our newsletter or participated in our Meetings and who are considered an asset of the entity to keep developing.

This 'Casa Común' classroom has made our entity start working more profoundly on awareness, making us think about organising campaigns we had not undertaken before.

Another benefit also contributed by the project is the existence of a highly multi-purpose space in which we will be able to keep developing activities for the entity: training for the beneficiaries of our projects, training for the workers of the entity, meetings with volunteers...

From the migration projects, we have also been proposed to use the classroom to offer the young migrants with whom we work training as intercultural mediators, thus providing them with the resources to rise as active agents of change in our goal to address migration from a perspective that fosters opportunities for the people to generate other participation models and enrich our way to understand reality and transmit it, generating other ways to spread and understand the migration phenomenon and its reality.

All the elderly people and schoolchildren who have participated in the proposed activities, the talks, the shared working days, etc. have stressed the need for the project, because the group of which we wanted to raise awareness — migrant people — has directly participated in it in a leading role, making that the developed activities had a reality touch that takes deeper roots in the people at which it is aimed and managing to fulfil the goal of informing and bringing society closer to the reality of migrant people in kind and positive contexts..

5.4. CULTURE

5.4.1. BOARDS OF TRUSTEES AND ASSOCIATIONS



PRINCESS OF ASTURIAS FOUNDATION

The Princess of Asturias Foundation was created in Oviedo in 1980. This institution confers every year, since 1981, the Princess of Asturias Awards, which recognise the scientific, technical, cultural, social and humane work performed by individuals, work teams or institutions. In addition to these prizes, it also grants the Exemplary Town of Asturias Award.

The EDP Foundation has the honour of being a member of the Board of Trustees of this institution and collaborating with its activities since its creation.

In 2019, as in previous years, the EDP Foundation loaned six 100% electric vehicles to the Princess of Asturias Foundation for travelling around during the week of the Awards, an event with a significant impact on a local, national and international level

GUGGENHEIM MUSEO BILBAO FOUNDATION

The Guggenheim Museum Bilbao is one of the emblematic buildings of the third millennium, associated with concepts of contemporaneity, technology, avant-garde and design, in addition to the fact that it has become a cultural icon. The EDP Foundation is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Museum Foundation and actively collaborates on its activities since 2004.



Since its inauguration in 1997, the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao has received more than one million visitors per year. There is no doubt that this museum has led the revitalisation of the city of Bilbao, improving its image and promoting tourism in the region, which has translated into an extraordinary impact on the economy and the Basque society.

ROYAL ASSOCIATION OF FRIENDS OF THE MUSEO REINA SOFÍA

The Museo Reina Sofía is one of the world's top contemporary art museums. Its Association of Friends promotes, boosts and supports cultural actions carried out in connection with the mission and the activity of the museum, such as exhibitions, workshops for children, cultural trips or guided tours, and for that purpose, it relies on partnerships with several entities committed to culture, including the EDP Foundation.



ARTIUM CONTEMPORARY ART MUSEUM

Artium, Centro-Museo Vasco de Arte Contemporáneo is a contemporary art museum and centre for cultural activities located in Vitoria. It was created with funds from the Local Government of Álava, and the EDP Foundation is an active member of its board of trustees, contributing to its promotion and consolidation.



5.4.2. ART

CENTRO DE ESCULTURA DE CANDÁS - ANTÓN GRANT

The Centro de Escultura de Candás (Candás Sculpture Centre) association manages the events carried out around the Museo Antón: guided tours, workshops for primary, secondary and pre-school students and the maintenance of the museum itself. Every year, the Centro de Escultura de Candás-Museo Antón convenes the Anton Grant for the Support of Sculptural Creation which, sponsored by the EDP Foundation, is aimed at the execution of an exhibition sculpture project to be displayed in the temporary exhibition rooms of the Museo Antón.

This way, the artist who is selected as the recipient of the grant receives a significant boost to his or her artistic career. This year, the awardee of the 26th Anton Grant for the Support of Sculptural Creation in 2019 was the artist Elisa Torreira with her project entitled 'Área Protegida' (Protected area).

ECOVISIONARIOS

The Ecovisionarios exhibition is an international project that consists in an exhibition accompanied by a manifesto in which more than forty artists and architects take up a stance on the environmental crisis of our planet. The exhibition was displayed in Basel (Switzerland), in the Haus der Elektronischen Künste, with different pieces from those presented in Lisbon.

This exhibition project also visited Gijón, sponsored by the EDP Foundation, specifically the Laboral Centro de Arte y Creación Industrial, from 24 May to 26 October. The exhibition was distributed in four rooms, each of them addressing a different subject (disaster, coexistence, extinction and adaptation). Different international artists and architecture professionals showed in this exposition their view on environment; among the projects included, one offered the chance to discover how electricity was generated from bacteria present in.





PATRIMONIUINDUSTRIAL.COM

Patrimoniuindustrial.com is an online platform to access the industrial heritage of the Principality of Asturias through a combination of technology, design, audio visual creation, academic rigour and marketing. With the support of several sponsors, which include the EDP Foundation, the project was born with the goal of gathering pieces of the Asturian legacy until reaching the 500 heritage resources audio visually portraited.

This conception is the result of more than two years of work by a team comprised by 30 professionals from the fields of industrial heritage, cinema, photography, art history, architecture, design, web programming, journalism and marketing.





L.E.V.

L.E.V. (Laboratory of Visual Electronics) is a platform specialised in the production and spreading of electronic sound creation and its relation to visual arts. Pioneer in its field in Europe, it has been making the natural synergy between sound and image come together with new artistic trends for more than 12 years, giving special importance to live actions. Thanks to the collaboration of the EDP Foundation, in 2019, this initiative could be enjoyed for the first time in Spain.

The Turkish artist Refik Anadol presented his project 'Melting Memories' in the Espacio Fundación EDP - Iglesia de La Laboral, incorporating new technological advances which showed visitors the aesthetic interpretations of motor movements inside the human brain, and which had significant repercussion on the media

The exhibition was inaugurated on 29 April and could be visited until 14 May for free.

CONTEST FOR CHILDREN 'PARQUES NATURALES'

The EDP Foundation supported the drawing contest for children 'Parques Naturales' (Nature Reserves), promoted by the Asturian newspaper La Nueva España, with the aim that the students reflected their view of the protected natural areas of the Principality of Asturias, thus showcasing their artistic talent.

In order to participate in the contest, the students had to produce their drawings on a DIN A4 sheet and take a brief test containing questions related to Asturian nature reserves.

Of course, we encouraged all our employees to invite their children to participate in this initiative.



AZKUNA ZENTROA – GABONAK ARTE

The leisure and culture centre Azkuna Zentroa of Bilbao organised in Christmas 2019 the fifth series of 'Gabonak Art' – an innovative cultural programme sponsored by the EDP Foundation and fundamentally aimed at getting families to enjoy in an interactive way experiences in different artistic and cultural disciplines, such as theatre, dance, architecture, music and audio visual works.





POEMAD

Between 17 October and 3 November 2019, the 9th Madrid Poetry Festival was held in the Centro Cultural Conde Duque, supported by the EDP Foundation. On this occasion, it dedicated its programme to the concept of poetic correspondence, using intercultural and artistic dialogue as common thread. Furthermore, it honoured the Portuguese poetess Sophia de Mello, coinciding with the centennial of her birth.

This time, the closing event of this Madrid Poetry Festival was conducted by the Catalan poet Joan Margarit with his show entitled 'Un hivern fascinant'.



5.4.3. MUSIC

FUNDACIÓN OPERA DE OVIEDO

The EDP Foundation is one of the top sponsors of the Fundación Ópera de Oviedo (Oviedo Opera Foundation), an entity whose main purpose is organising concerts and activities related to the opera, including the organisation of the annual opera season in the Teatro Campoamor in Oviedo. The significance of this artistic activity involves, other than a not-to-miss cultural event, an economic boost to the city, since different sectors benefit from it for several months.

Furthermore, also in partnership with the Fundación Ópera de Oviedo, it collaborated on 'Historia de una Semilla' (A story of a seed), a show narrating a tender story about love for nature accompanied by beautiful images and music.







CONCERT SERIES AND PIANO SESSIONS OF THE OVIEDO CITY COUNCIL

Once again, this year, the EDP Foundation partnered with the Oviedo City Council in the sponsorship of concert series in which the world's best orchestras and piano performers participate; these series have become a must-attend event in the territory which is already part of the cultural identity of the city and the region.



FUNDACIÓN MUSEO EVARISTO VALLE

The main purpose of this Foundation based in Gijón is to exhibit, maintain and preserve the works of the painter from Gijón Evaristo Valle and, in broader terms, to promote cultural activities related to art and to the work of this well-known artist, partly thanks to the regular collaboration of the EDP Foundation.



SCHOLA CANTORUM

The choir Schola Cantorum, founded at the end of the 1970s, is now undergoing a second successful period, following its reunion some decades later, always under the musical direction of Fernández Avello. Like every year, it organised its popular music concerts and its traditional Christmas programme with the collaboration of the EDP Foundation.



CENTRO NIEMEYER - SUENA LA CÚPULA

The EDP Foundation sponsored the concert series 'Suena la cúpula' (The dome sounds), held between 27 October and 29 December in the Centro Niemeyer of Avilés; it consisted of three chamber music concerts in which five great artists took the stage: the violinist Jorge Jiménez, the pianist Noelia Rodiles, the cellist Fernando Arias and the Asturian artists María Cueva and Paula Lueje.

LA CASTALIA

The 5th International Course on Singing and Vocal Repertoire of the association 'La Castalia' was held in the month of July in Oviedo, sponsored by the EDP Foundation. This course included this year a workshop on lyrical performance in order to give students practical and real experience in dramatic performance.



ORGAN CONCERTS IN VILLAVICIOSA

Once again, this year, the EDP Foundation collaborated on the $9 \mathrm{th}$ Villaviciosa Organ Series, which involves the organisation of different concerts during the months of July and August, with the participation of national and international top-level musicians, and including on this occasion an English horn and organ duet as its main novelty.

ABAO

The EDP Foundation has collaborated once again this year with the ABAO (Bilbao Friends of the Opera Association), a benchmark in the Basque and Spanish cultural sector which stands out for its international scope, with a programme on a par with the top theatres.

This year, B2B customers and EDP's employees were able to enjoy a guided tour around the backstage and the stage and take pictures with the singers at the end of the opera 'Lucia Di Lammermoor'.

The Foundation's support to this association includes the collaboration on ABAO TXIKI, targeted at the little ones, who had a great time this year in the opera 'Ali Baba and the Forty Thieves'.

Out of the received tickets, a significant part was distributed to NGOs that work with children at risk of social exclusion.





KURSAAL ESZENA

Its support to Kursaal Eszena (Conference Centre and Auditorium of San Sebastián) allows the EDP Foundation to contribute to the cultural and leisure offer of Donostia-San Sebastián and Guipúzcoa, thanks to the varied programme of this centre.





MUSICAL FORTNIGHT - SAN SEBASTIÁN

Since 1993, the month of August turns San Sebastián into a musical benchmark thanks to this festival, which is the oldest festival in Spain and one of the oldest in Europe, no less. During its fifteen days, it offers more than one hundred concerts and shows scattered all around the city.

This year, the EDP Foundation sponsored the opening concert with the Malher Chamber Orchestra and the Orfeón Donostiarra, conducted by Jacob Hrusa.





SANTANDER INTERNATIONAL FESTIVAL

This festival is one of the most relevant cultural events in Cantabria; it offers, during several days, a range of different performing arts shows, such as dance, music, theatre, ballet, opera and recitals.



SOCIEDAD FILARMÓNICA DE OVIEDO

The Sociedad Filarmónica de Oviedo (Oviedo Philharmonic Society) is the senior musical entity in Asturias. Founded in 1907, it organises an annual concert season in the Teatro Filarmónica, with which the EDP Foundation usually collaborates, in line with our firm commitment to the support for arts and culture.





ORQUESTA SINFÓNICA DEL PRINCIPADO DE ASTURIAS (OSPA)

Heir of the former Orquesta Sinfónica Provincial, whose origin dates back to 1939, and of the subsequent Orquesta Sinfónica de Asturias, the OSPA (Symphony orchestra of the Principality of Asturias) is a benchmark in and out of Asturias for its versatility, its performance ability and its undeniable quality, which make it indisputably worthy of the our Foundation's support.



GISELA JOÃO CONCERT IN MADRID

The Portuguese singer Gisela João is one of the great voices of Fado and she is currently considered one of the most important performers in Portuguese music. In the framework of the 17th Muestra de Cultura Portuguesa (Portuguese Culture Festival) in Spain organised by the Embassy of Portugal, this great artist gave a concert in Madrid, sponsored by the EDP Foundation, including songs that combine verses and melodic spaces, where Fado is contemporary and with no artifice.

5.5. ENVIRONMENT

5.5.1. PLANTING FOR BIODIVERSITY


This almost traditional programme is carried out in partnership with the environmentalist organisation FAPAS (Fund for the Protection of Wild Animals) and seeks to increase the forest area in an eco-friendly way, ensuring the protection of biodiversity and allowing the production of fruits to feed the fauna in the area.

In 2019, 9,300 trees were planted in Asturias in areas of public use, specifically in Ribadedeva and in the University of Oviedo Campus in Gijón. This year, the initiative was completed with a programme for the removal of eucalyptus, which were in turn used as fertiliser to reforest the land with native vegetation.

In the university campus, it aims to create a significant leafy forest with biological diversity, since many of the replanted species produce fruits that feed the squirrels.











5.5.2. FISH RESTOCKING

In 2019, we also committed to fish restocking with native species and, thanks to our partnership with the Asociación de Pescadores y Amigos del Nalón (Association of Fishers and Friends of the Nalón River), the EDP Foundation was able to improve, once again this year, our rivers' health.

Thanks to this partnership that has gone on for several years now, we have managed to reverse the continuing trend of trout population decline.

On this occasion, students from the school 'Colegio Rural Agrupado del Alto Nalón' released 5,000 young river trout into the main bed of the river and learnt about the environmental importance of these fishing initiatives.

We also collaborated once again this year with the Asociación de Pescadores Fuentes del Narcea (Fuentes del Narcea Association of Fishers) and with other projects carried out by other associations, such as the Real Asociación Asturiana de Pesca Fluvial (Asturian Royal Association of Fluvial Fishing).





5.5.3. FUNDACIÓN DEL PATRIMONIO NATURAL DE CASTILLA Y LEÓN NATURAL

The Fundación del Patrimonio Natural de Castilla y León (Castile and Leon Natural Heritage Foundation) is a foundation linked to the Castile and Leon Regional Government which seeks to promote, maintain and manage the natural heritage of the Region. EDPR and the Fundación del Patrimonio Natural de Castilla y León have been partnering since 2014 to carry out several environmental actions aimed at the conservation of the red kite.

In 2019, the following actions were executed:

Repair of one red kite transmitter purchased in previous campaigns, acquisition of six new transmitters and re-attachment of devices to chicks in their nests. It includes capture sessions by the SEO staff and the contribution of the materials to be used.

- Receipt of data from the different red kite transmitters during 2019.
- Actions to track the breeding population of red kite in the province of Salamanca.
- Acquisition of pictures and contracting of authors for writing several chapters of the monograph on the red kite that is expected to be presented throughout 2020.



5.5.4. FUNDACIÓN OSO DE ASTURIAS (FOA)

The Fundación Oso de Asturias (Asturias Bear Foundation) is a private non-profit entity, whose purpose is the promotion and development of activities aimed at the conservation of the Cantabrian brown bear and its habitat.

The EDP Foundation collaborated on the environmental reporters in Protected Natural Areas project, a field campaign in which four environmental reporters with specific training were hired and performed information and awareness tasks in: Senda del Oso, Parque Natural de Somiedo (Somiedo Nature Reserve), Parque Natural de Las Ubiñas - La Mesa (Las Ubiñas - La Mesa Nature Reserve) and Parque Natural de Las Fuentes del Narcea, Ibias y Degaña (Las Fuentes del Narcea, Ibias and Degaña Nature Reserve).



5.5.5. GRUPO DE REHABILITACIÓN DE LA FAUNA AUTÓCTONA Y SU HÁBITAT (GREFA)

The GREFA (Group for the rehabilitation of native fauna and its habitat) is a non-government non-profit organisation which was born in 1981 as an association for the study and conservation of nature.

In 2019, EDPR and GREFA signed three partnership agreements to develop the following projects:

- Sponsorship of two specimens of black vulture, classified as a species at risk of extinction, within the conservation programme 'Proyecto Monachus'.
- Assessment of the impact of the waste treatment plant located in the area of the wind farms Altos del Voltoya on the black vulture and red kite populations.
- Correction of an overhead line situated in the area of the wind farms Altos del Voltoya.
