



ABOUT THIS REPORT

2014 was the first full year of operations of the EDP Foundation, set up on 5 November 2013 and made up by Hidroeléctrica del Cantábrico, Naturgas Energía Grupo, EDP Renováveis and EDP Sucursal España. This means that the activity of all the areas in Spain is now linked up, thus enabling transparent, open and uniform dialogue with all the parties involved.

The mission of the EDP Foundation is to consolidate EDP social responsibility towards its stakeholders in the geographical areas where it operates, a responsibility that the group has set down in

a Stakeholders Relationship Policy based on four main commitments: understating, communicating, trusting and collaborating.

And it is precisely in line with this collaboration commitment that the EDP Foundation organises, from a global sustainable development perspective, activities in the environmental, social, cultural and educational areas, which are described herein. LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

I am pleased to write this short piece on the spirit that is the driving force behind the work that the EDP Group has entrusted to us and on the lines of activity that we prioritised last year, and which are described in greater detail on the following pages.

Our Foundation, as is known, fosters and supports environmental, cultural, social and education initiatives, along with other similar ones, in the geographical areas where the EDP Group operates. This involved an investment of over €3.3 million in 2014.

- ⚙️ During this year, we continued to be committed to training and work-life experiences, by means of programmes that encourage responsible use of energy in schools, such as Love Live Our Energy! (¡Viva nuestra Energía!) and Your Energy! (¡Tu Energía!), in which 65,958 students at 356 schools took part. Study grants were also awarded to underprivileged families, prizes for excellence and paid first work experience internships for over 300 students were organised in conjunctio with different universities.
- ⚙️ In the cultural sphere, music was in centre stage and we sponsored symphony concerts and opera seasons. However, other activities were organised including lectures and exhibitions showcasing the best in this field and facilitating access to and enjoyment of culture for tens of thousands of people.
- ⚙️ The Foundation also worked with leading institutions of the ilk of the Princess of Asturias Foundation or the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao, along with many other prestigious entities in different areas.
- ⚙️ As regards the environmental contributions, special mention should be made of the planting of 12,460 trees, along with the help provided to different anglers' associations to release thousands of juvenile fish in order to restock and improve the fish population of the rivers.
- ⚙️ In the social area, thanks to the Responsible Points programme, 49,000 euros were sent to the NGOs selected by the Group's customers to help them implement their deserving schemes.

The Foundation was also involved in the different volunteering programmes of the EDP Group, including the Environmental Part of Us (Parte de Nosotros Ambiental) and Part of Us at Christmas (Parte de Nosotros en Navidad).

Sports activities were also organised to wide public acclaim, such as fun runs and other Events, including the III Family Run, in Bilbao, with over 3,000 participants and the money collected was given to the San Filipo Project, or the XXXI San Silvestre Run, in Oviedo, which beat its own record as over 5,000 runners entered.

- ⚙️ On the other hand, impetus was given to the dissemination of the EDP Foundation activities thanks to the new website, which was up and running halfway through the year.

Finally, at the end of 2014, the Strategic Agenda 2015-2017 was defined, which will allow the Foundation to consolidate its mission, in order to bring onboard the Stakeholders defined in the EDP policy.

The Foundation as an integral part of the Group and in order to create value for its Stakeholders therefore established three lines of action:

1. Promoting and maximising the existing schemes.
2. Working with the business units to drive sustainable development (Energy Solidarity)
3. New programme to support social transformation: EDP Solidarity.

I believe that this is all proof of our meticulous and intense work aimed at contributing, even though it may be modestly, to a fairer, more balanced and open society. I would therefore like to express my great gratitude to all those people involved at our entity and to all those people who belong to the EDP Group and without whose generous collaboration it would not have been possible.

INTERVIEW WITH THE CEO OF EDP SPAIN

EDP FOUNDATION: TOWARDS GREATER SOCIAL COMMITMENT

How would you assess the EDP Foundation's activity in 2014?

2014 has been a very positive year. The EDP Foundation has been active in the Education & Research, Culture, Environmental and Social areas in line with the Activities Plan, and involving a €3.3 million investment.

Investment in the Education and Research area accounted for 58% of the total, where special mention should be made of the grant programme, benefitting over 300 students, and the Love Live Our Energy! and Your Energy! programmes, in which 65,958 students at 356 schools took part.

Investment in the cultural sphere, which accounted for 20% of the total and which is used to sponsor opera seasons, symphony concerts, lectures and exhibitions, helped to showcase the best of this field to thousands of people.

Investments in the Environmental and Social areas completed the EDP Foundation activities. They included planting 12,460 trees and donating €49,000 to NGOs chosen by the customers, through the Responsible Points programme.

Special mention should also be made of preparing the Strategic Agenda 2015-2017, which defines the main areas of action of the EDP Foundation and identifies new schemes.

What are the main areas of action for the period 2015-2017?

The Strategic Agenda defined by the EDP Foundation for 2015-2017 is based on three cornerstones: First, to give impetus to the current grants and schemes. Second, to work with the business units to drive sustainable

development. Special mention should be made here of the launch in 2015 of Energy Solidarity and, thirdly, to create a new programme to drive social transformation, the EDP Solidarity programme.

The aim is to consolidate the mission of the EDP Foundation, by creating value for society, by means of different schemes related to education, environment, driving culture and its dissemination, helping the underprivileged and fostering, among others the values of sport.

What do the Energy Solidarity and EDP Solidarity schemes involve?

Energy Solidarity is a scheme that seeks to increase the safety, well-being and energy efficiency of the most underprivileged families. In conjunction with Cáritas and Cruz Roja and, through different energy improvement actions, nearly 100 families in Asturias and the Basque Country will be helped in 2015. After a preliminary study has been carried out, measures to be taken will be planned for each residential unit. Thus, for example, basic equipment, such as radiators, boilers and lights, may be replaced. Volunteers will also help the EDP Foundation to implement this scheme.

The EDP Solidarity programme seeks to help to improve the quality of life and facilitate the integration of the most underprivileged. This will be achieved by backing projects aimed at offsetting the most priority social needs, fostering improving the quality of life of the people affected, the integration of the communities at risk of social exclusion and promoting employment and entrepreneurship. This is all implemented through sustainable projects in the areas

where EDP operates. In 2015, the programme has been allocated with up to €344,000, according to the projects that justify the participation of the EDP Foundation.

What are the priorities for 2015?

In keeping with the EDP Group strategy, we want a Foundation committed to local communities and that drives change to achieve the sustainable development of society.

We want to give impetus to the current schemes, such as the grants, the Long Live Our Energy! scheme and the backing of different environmental, social and cultural initiatives, in order to increase the number of beneficiaries and maximise the impact of the initiatives on the life of those same communities.

We want the new Energy Solidarity and EDP Solidarity schemes to drive the social area of the EDP Foundation to ensure there is greater commitment to local communities. The support of the different business units, along with getting the employees to get more involved in the EDP Foundation schemes, is fundamental to ensure their success.


MISSION

The mission of an organisation reflects what it is, what it does; the vision expresses what it wants to become...


The **Mission** of the EDP Foundation is to strengthen the commitment of the EDP Group in the geographical spheres in which the group operates, with special emphasis on environmental, social, cultural and educational areas within a perspective of global sustainable development, where the efficient and responsible use and generation of energy plays a decisive role.

Based on its current functions, the EDP Foundation's **Vision** is to be a Foundation committed to local communities, which drives change to achieve the sustainable development of society.

In order to achieve the Vision, the EDP Foundation has defined a **Strategy**, a path that will allow it to achieve that goal, while always acting in accordance with certain values. The values reflect the principles and beliefs of the bodies of the EDP Foundation, and as such, remain unaltered even if the Strategy changes.



The value of the schemes promoted in the different geographical areas in 2014 stood at €3.3 million.



VISION

VALUES

EXCELLENCE

The EDP University Challenge is a programme introduced by EDPR in 2009. Its objective is to contribute to developing academic excellence in undergraduates, post-graduates and PhD students.

INITIATIVE

The EDP Foundation is driving a new initiative, EDP Solidarity, to improve the quality of life and facilitate the integration of the most underprivileged, by supporting projects aimed at offsetting the most pressing social needs.

TRUST

The EDP Foundation takes part in the Responsible Points programme. In this programme, customers donate the points they obtain for their energy consumption to solidarity projects run by different NGOs. The Foundation matches the donation.

SUSTAINABILITY

A customer, a tree campaign. Each new EDP in Spain customer that signs up for the e-billing is further proof of the company's commitment to the environment. The EDP Foundation has thus signed cooperation agreements to plant native trees with different local councils.

INNOVATION

The EDP Foundation is going to implement an innovative scheme, Energy Solidarity, a project that seeks to increase the safety, well-being and energy efficiency of the most underprivileged families. In conjunction with Cáritas and Cruz Roja and, through different energy improvement actions, nearly 100 families in Asturias and the Basque Country will be helped.

COMMITMENTS

TO EDUCATION AND RESEARCH

The EDP Foundation has agreements in place with Spanish (Oviedo, Murcia, Cantabria, Madrid and the Basque Country) and foreign (Paris, Lisbon and Porto) universities. Over 300 of their students thus completed paid internships at different EDP premises during 2014. This project started over 30 years ago.

TO CULTURE

EDP is on the board of the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao, which is one of the iconic buildings of the third millennium and associated to concepts of contemporariness, technology, avant-garde and design.

The EDP Foundation is also a member of the Board of the Princess of Asturias Awards, an institution that each year issues a series of awards that recognises the human, social, cultural, technical and scientific work of individuals, entities or organisations from around the world.

TO THE ENVIROMENT


EDPR, through the EDP Foundation, and the Castilla y León Natural Heritage Foundation have decided to back a series of environmental measures to conserve the red kite, a species with special protection status. This is of particular interest to EDPR as part of its strategy to manage biodiversity and the environmental risks inherent to its activity. They have signed a 2014-2016 Agreement, worth over €200,000.

TO SOCIETY

The employees of the group, members of the EDP Foundation, helped with different projects through the Volunteering scheme. Special mention should be made of schemes such as Part of Us at Christmas (collected 10,000 euros for different NGOs and to help electrify a town in Honduras), Solidarity Computers (Ordenadores Solidarios) (over 11,000 euros collected and over 250 computers donated), Painting Smiles II (Pintando Sonrisas II) (helping to paint the Cáritas building), Kilos of Solidarity (Kilos de Solidaridad) (over 580 kilos collected of food for different NGOs), etc.

STRATEGIC PLAN 2015-2017

In order to developing the relationship with its stakeholders coherently, the EDP Group has defined two instruments: the Stakeholders Policy and a Segmentation Model that has allowed four major stakeholder categories to be identified: the Market, the Value Chain, Democracy and the Territorial & Social Organisation.



EDP FOUNDATION SCHEMES

THE EDP FOUNDATION, AS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE GROUP, SHARES THIS CLASSIFICATION AND RUNS SCHEMES TO CREATE VALUE IN THE FOUR STAKEHOLDER CATEGORIES, EVEN THOUGH ITS ACTIONS ARE FOCUSED ON THE VALUE CHAIN, WORKING WITH BUSINESS UNITS TO DRIVE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT, AND IN THE TERRITORIAL AND SOCIAL SETTING, BY GIVING IMPETUS TO PROJECTS IN THE GEOGRAPHICAL AREAS WHERE EDP OPERATES.

After an preliminary study, measures, such as replacing basic equipment (radiators, boilers and lamps), will be planned for each household.

EDP volunteers also help the EDP Foundation to run this scheme and their input is managed through the Corporate Volunteer Programme.

The EDP Solidarity 2015 programme has been allocated €344,000 in financing, according to the projects that justify the participation of the EDP Foundation.

Acquiring greater knowledge of society's needs.


AREAS FOR ACTION: 2014 MILESTONES

EDUCATION AND RESEARCH

OVER 300 INTERNS AT EDP

Thanks to the agreements that the EDP Foundation has in place with Spanish (Oviedo, Murcia, Cantabria, Madrid and the Basque Country) and foreign (Paris, Lisbon and Porto) universities, as part of a scheme that began over 30 years ago.




STARTINNOVA

This initiative set up by El Comercio newspaper seeks to foster the entrepreneur culture among young upper secondary and vocational training students by means of an e-learning platform. It was held for the second time in 2014, with 183 students taking part, and the EDP Foundation helped to develop the programme, where different groups of young people presented their business project to the jury of experts from Oviedo University.



LONG LIVE OUR ENERGY! / YOUR ENERGY! SCHOOL PROGRAMMES

The scheme seeks to disseminate sustainable development in schools. It has been run in the Autonomous Regions of Asturias, Murcia, Cantabria, the Basque Country, Castilla-La Mancha and Madrid by means of the agreements in place with the Ministries of Education of those regions, thanks to which the programme is part of the curriculum content in Primary Education.




EDUCATIONAL GRANTS

Set up 34 years ago, Green Education is an EDPR programme that provides educational grants (€ 500, € 1000 or € 3000 depending on the educational level), to school or university students with good academic grades and from families with low economic resources.



GAS LEARNING CENTER

The EDP Foundation is working with the Bilbao Engineering Faculty at the University of the Basque Country to help its students with their end-of-degree projects, under the supervision of a lecturer and/or EDP employee, on areas related to natural gas. Six projects were completed in the 2014 academic year.




EDP UNIVERSITY CHALLENGE

Programme introduced by EDPR in Spain 2009. Its objective is to contribute to developing academic excellence in students on degree, post-graduate and PhD students (1st and 2nd cycle of the Bologna process), by means of organising a competition for university projects in the field of renewable energies. The sixth challenge stood out for the large number of university projects entered (122) with 202 students taking part from 69 faculties. That represents an increase of 45% with respect to the projects entered the previous year.



SCHOOL VISITS TO EDP FACILITIES

In 2014, the hydroelectric and thermal power stations were visited by over 2,500 primary and secondary schoolchildren interested in learning about the process to generate electricity.



COOPERATION WITH ENTITIES RELATED TO SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT:

Including:

DIPC Donostia International Physics Center

Entity to promote scientific research and technological development in the field of Applied and Basic Physics, which is of interest for Society and for international scientific development, with special interest in nano-sciences.

FUNSEAM Foundation for Environmental and Energy Sustainability

Non-profit institution whose main objective is to organise activities in the area of energy and environmental sustainability.



FINBA Foundation for Biomedical Research and Innovation of Asturias

It seeks to facilitate research in the field of biomedicine and new facilities have therefore been set up next to the new University Hospital of Asturias (HUCA).

DEUSTO INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH SCHOOL

The EDP Foundation reached an agreement to sponsor and take part in the Co-funding of Regional, National and International Programmes, PhD programmes at Deusto University in different specialised branches where the EDP Foundation offers a three-year grant.

GLOBAL WIND DAY

On 13 June, an open day was held at the Ávila Oeste wind farm to mark World Wind Day, which aimed to bring wind energy to society and improve relations with local stakeholders such as local councils, property owners, press, etc. The event was attended by the mayors and local councillors, along with the leading institutions of Ávila, and 120 students from different schools.

Activities were organised for old and young alike. The visitors could learn about all the details of wind power and its importance during a day that was educational for the children, but was also an opportunity for the authorities to learn more about the work that EDPR carried out at the wind farm every day.



ITINERANT UNIVERSITY OF THE SEA (UIM)

Spanish and Portuguese platform for training, dissemination and research on sea-related topics, that seeks to increase the maritime awareness of young people and provide additional Training. Seventy-five students were on the 2014 voyage of the Portuguese navy's sail training vessel, which was used for the educational activities.

SPONSORSHIPS AND ASSOCIATIONS

THE PRINCESS OF ASTURIAS FOUNDATION

Every year, since 1981, this institution has conferred the Princess of Asturias Awards, that recognise the human, social, cultural, technical and scientific work of individuals, entities or organisations internationally. EDP is a member of the board of this institution and has cooperated with its activities since it was founded.



GUGGENHEIM MUSEUM BILBAO FOUNDATION

One of the iconic buildings of the third millennium, associated to concepts of contemporariness, technology, avant-garde and design. EDP has been on its Board and supporting the museum since 2004.



FRIENDS OF THE REINA SOFÍA FOUNDATION

One of the leading museums of contemporary painting in the world, visited by hundreds of thousands of people every year. This Foundation fosters, gives impetus to and supports the cultural actions organised in relation to the mission and activity of the Museum, such as exhibitions, children's workshops, cultural trips or guided tours.



INCUNA

Association whose purpose is to study, conserve, preserve and enhance heritages, by fostering the training and dissemination of the natural, cultural and industrial heritage, by working with international, national and regional universities, companies, public authorities and institutions.



ARTIUM MODERN ART MUSEUM CENTRE

Artium is, as a museum and cultural activities centre, a benchmark for its dissemination and heritage work in the area of contemporary creation, and EDP is an active member of its Board.

ART

CANDÁS SCULPTURE CENTRE – ANTÓN SCHOLARSHIP

It manages the events organised to do with the Antón Museum. Since 1990, it has rewarded the sculptural spirit and has set up a scholarship programme. Each year, it organises a sculpture contest in order to select a sculptor and help them on their artistic career.



OVIEDO ART SCHOOL – MOTIVA 2014

Initiative by the Department of Advertising Graphic Art at Oviedo Art School set up in 1997 given the need to teach and motivate in graphic design to all sectors, whether social, business, professional, institutional or academic.

ALNORTE ASSOCIATION

Under the aegis of the El Comercio newspaper, the association aims to bring contemporary art to the general public so that can experience it with the help of exhibitions, workshops and courses conducted in the main cities of Asturias.

EFE AGENCY

To mark its 75th anniversary, the EDP Foundation was involved in different activities in the Autonomous Communities of the Principality of Asturias, Cantabria and the Basque Country.

MUSIC

OVIEDO OPERA FOUNDATION

The purpose of this institution is to organise activities and concerts related to the Opera and, which includes organising an annual opera season.

Asturias, and specifically Oviedo, boasts one of the best opera seasons in Spanish, which has a high economic impact given the work load involved for different sectors over several months.

The EDP Foundation has become one of its main sponsors.



CAMERATA REVILLAGIGEDO

This institution was set up in 1993 and since then its objective has been to achieve an easily identifiable sound effect that defines its choral personality.



SAN SEBASTIÁN MUSICAL FORTNIGHT

Classical music festival that dates back to 1939 and is now the oldest musical festivals in Spain and one of the oldest in Europe. The EDP Foundation sponsored the 75th San Sebastián Musical Fortnight.

PRINCIPALITY OF ASTURIAS SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

One of the leading orchestras on the Spanish symphony scene. It has an exhaustive first-rate programme that it performs basically in the main cities of Asturias and also through its outstanding participation in the Oviedo Opera Festival.

KURSAAL ESZENA

This leading light of Donostia-San Sebastián and Guipúzcoa's cultural offerings puts on a first-class and varied programme that drives the local cultural scene and boosts the image of the province and its capital. The EDP Foundation was involved in the concert by the BBC Philharmonic Orchestra.



ABAO

This institution seeks to organise concerts and activities related to the world of Opera in Bilbao and which includes the organising an internationally renowned annual opera season and which is a leading light in Europe. The EDP Foundation is one of the sponsors for the 2014-2015 seasons, where six operas will be performed at the Euskalduna Conference Centre and Music Hall.

SANTANDER INTERNATIONAL MUSIC FESTIVAL (FIS)

The festival was sponsored by the EDP Foundation as in the three previous ones.

The programme included the English Baroque Soloists and the Monteverdi Choir, conducted by Sir John Eliot Gardiner, who performed a selection of Baroque music by Bach, Scarlatti and Handel.



TXIKI OPERA

This children's opera is sponsored by the EDP Foundation. On the 3rd, 4th and 5th, it performed a Christmas Carol based on Charles Dickens's popular tale, with 5 performances at Bilbao's Arriaga Theatre.

2014 MADRID FADO FESTIVAL

Yet again this year, local residents and tourists alike could enjoy the concerts, lectures, exhibitions and films that turn the Spanish capital into a piece of Portugal during a weekend in June and which was sponsored by the EDP Foundation.



THE ENVIROMENT

A CUSTOMER, A TREE CAMPAIGN

A tree is planted for each new EDP Spain customer that changes to electronic bill, which is a further expression of the energy company's commitment to the environment.

The EDP Foundation has signed agreements with local councils to plant native species trees. The agreements establish that the council in question will allocate areas that it owns to be enhanced using sustainability principles; while the Foundation will be in charge of planting and looking after those trees.

In Asturias during 2014, 10,000 trees were planted in an area of Valledor, a municipality of Pola de Allande, which was razed by fires at the end of 2011.

In the Basque Country, an activity was organised, in conjunction with Vitoria-Gasteiz City Council and with the support of the El Correo Group, for the city's residents to plant 2,460 native species of trees in the Green Belt of the Green Capital 2012.



A DRAWING, A TREE

Hundreds of children welcomed the spring, in the Plaza de la Gesta square in Oviedo, during an event organised by the EDP Foundation together with FAPAS, where over 1,000 cherry saplings were handed out in exchange for nature-related drawings.

Long Live Our Energy! characters, Vera Rivera, Juan Volcán and Nano Solano, provided the entertainment.



FISH RESTOCKING

The EDP Foundation and the Association of Anglers and Friends of the River Nalón worked together yet again on the fish restocking of the River Nalón. Over 50 students from the Elena Sánchez Tamargo school, in Pola de Lavina, helped to release 12,000 trout juveniles into the River Nalón, despite the heavy rain that fell all day.

An event was also organised to release young trout with the Fuentes del Narcea Anglers' Association and the Penlés Integration Support Centre (CAI), in Cangas del Narcea. This activity combined two aspects, on the one hand, it helped to restock the river with the releasing of young trout, and on other hand, it did its bit to integrate people with disability.

Furthermore, the EDP Foundation works with other associations in this field, takes part in projects proposed by other associations, such as the Royal River Fishing Association of Asturias.



COOPERATION WITH THE CASTILLA Y LEÓN NATURAL HERITAGE FOUNDATION

The Castilla y León Natural Heritage Foundation (FPN) is linked to the Castilla y León Regional Government. It seeks to promote, maintain and manage the natural heritage of the Castilla y León region.

EDPR, through the EDP Foundation, and the Castilla y León Natural Heritage Foundation have decided to back a series of environmental measure to conserve the red kite, a species with special protection status. This is of particular interest to EDPR as part of its strategy to manage biodiversity and the environmental risks inherent to its activity. The agreement, worth over €200,000, was signed on 1 December.

COOPERATION WITH THE ASTURIAS BEAR FOUNDATION

The Asturias Bear Foundation (FOA) is a non-profit private cultural entity, under the aegis of the Asturias regional government in order to promote and develop activities aimed at conserving the Cantabrian brown bear and its habitat, with special emphasis on dissemination and educational activities. The EDP Foundation has been working with the FOA since it was set up in 1992.



COOPERATION WITH MIGRES FOUNDATION

The Migres Foundation is a not-for-profit private entity that fosters research on the phenomenon of bird migration and organise activities aimed at sustainable development. The Migres Foundation has become an international benchmark in this field.

Since 2003, EDPR along with the other members of the Tarifa Wind Power Association, has been working with the Migres Foundation, which is tasked with preparing the project, implementation and monitoring measures to offset the wind farms in the municipal district of Tarifa. The final aim is to reduce the bird mortality in the different parks, establish the degree to which that mortality affects the local populations and, finally, conduct specific studies and recovery programmes for some of the affected species.



COOPERATION WITH MALAGA UNIVERSITY

The EDP Foundation is funding a study that seeks to delve further into the interactions between the Griffon vulture and the Egyptian vulture and the Bonelli eagle, after having detected population growth of the Griffon vulture in recent decades that is unprecedented for any other raptor species in Europe. On the other hand, the Egyptian vulture and the Bonelli eagle are in a very different situation, as they have suffered an overall setback in Europe over that time period.


VOLUNTEERING

The EDP Volunteering programme is run in all the companies of the Group and is in line with the strategic objectives of the company, where sustainable development is one of its cornerstones. Different activities were run, where special mention should be made of the help of the employees, all of whom are part of the EDP Foundation.

ENVIRONMENTAL PART OF US

Programme involving environmental protection actions

- On 28 June, EDPR held an environmental volunteering day where 51 volunteers worked on building an artificial island for birds, on constructing stone benches and on drainage channel naturalisation and planting riverbank species in the Valcabadillo lakes in Burgos province.
- This volunteer scheme is part of the overall Forest Part of Us campaign that the EDP Group runs in all the geographical areas where it is present.
- On 24 June, 12 EDP volunteers cleaned and fitted out a recreational area near to the Castejón thermal power station (Navarra).



PART OF US AT CHRISTMAS

Several schemes involving EDP employees (Three Kings Needed, I Paddle Tennis Charity Tournament Solidarity Wine, Solidarity Kiwis), were run, thanks to which over €10,000 was collected. The money was donated to different NGOs to fund their solidarity projects.

In December, EDPR also launched the Sharing Our Energy II campaign in conjunction with the Spanish NOG Cerro Verde Foundation. The main objective was to cover the second stage of bringing electricity to the town of Cerro Verde in Honduras.



SOLIDARITY COMPUTERS

The Solidarity Computers scheme consists of the employees donating a financial contribution for the computer equipment that are going to be reused, with the money collected going to the social organisations that they wish. There is also the option of equipment being directly donated to different entities.

In 2014, the amount collected by this scheme came to €11,732, from 187 computers, which the EDP Foundation has transferred to the selected NGOs. The number of computers directly donated came to 258.



PAINTING SMILES II

Volunteer scheme consisting of painting the second floor of the building that Cáritas has in Bilbao's Otxarkoaga district where different courses and activities are run. The EDP volunteers, under the guidance of professional painters, painted the rooms with bright colours where the teaching and childcare activities are run.

CHRISTMAS PLAYGROUND

In the same way as in previous years, a party was held at the Miribilla School in Bilbao for the local children, where the activities included playing on the EDP bouncy castles, face painting, balloon sculpting, a children's play and refreshments prepared and served by EDP volunteers.

This was followed by a lucky-dip with gifts for the more than 200 children at the party.



SOLIDARITY AID

In Madrid, Asturias and Seville, and in conjunction with the Food Banks, EDP volunteers helped to sort non-perishable food and to distribute it to different welfare organisations.



In Madrid, the volunteers also spent their time with the 25 children over four years old that have lunch at the Nuestra Señora de los Desamparados Home in the city.

In Zaragoza, they worked with the Refugio Brotherhood to distribute food and with the Gota de Leche kindergarten in the everyday running of its soup kitchen.

Over 30 volunteers from the company took part in the 5 different days that make up the Solidarity Aid campaign.




SOLIDARITY KILOS

In conjunction with the Nuestra Señora de los Desamparados Home in Madrid, Cáritas Parroquial in Seville, the Asturias Food Bank and the Zaragoza Refugio Brotherhood, all NGOs, the EDPR employees yet again displayed their commitment to the most needy by collecting staple products.

A total of 584 solidarity kilos was gathered.



The EDP Foundation, by means of its volunteer programme, also donated 14 tons of food to the Basque Country, Asturias, Merida and Figueres Food Banks.



SPORTS EVENTS

FUN RUNS

As is now traditional, in 2014 the EDP Foundation sponsored different runs that are highly popular in Asturias, such as the Ruta de la Reconquista Half Marathon in Cangas de Onis, the Mieres 10 Km, the Trubia Half Marathon or the Oviedo San Silvestre run. The latter is held on the last day of the year and attracts over 5,000 runners.



WOMEN'S RUN AT LA RODA

Entry was free for this 6.5 km run that was non competitive. We thus helped La Roda Local Council, the Castilla-La Mancha's Women's Centre and the Provincial Council to organise the event. Aside from taking part in the run, different local groups set up points to urge on the runners and 916 kilos of food - the same figure as the number of entries - were donated to Cáritas.



FAMILY FUN RUNS

III Family Fun Run

The El Correo Communication Group organised this fun run for the third time, with over 3,000 participants, and where the money gathered was donated to the San Filippo Project.

III Green Family Hike

Organised by the Correo Group and Vitoria-Gasteiz City Council, and sponsored by El Corte Inglés, the Obra Social La Caixa and the EDP Foundation, the route of the run was around 7.5 kilometres long and was suitable for the whole family. All the entry money collected was donated to Cáritas.

II Getxo Family Fun Run

Organised by the Correo Group and Gexto Local Council, and sponsored by El Corte Inglés, Seguros Bilbao and the EDP Foundation, it was a fund-raising day with the money going to help the family of the child from Beñat Mardaras, afflicted by a serious illness whose experimental treatment is being carried out at a US research centre.

IV BILBAO TRIATHLON

Organised by Innevento and with the support of Bilbao City Council, Bizkaia Provincial Council, El Corte Inglés, Caja Rural and the EDP Foundation, this event was held in Bilbao along its river estuary on the last weekend of May. Over 800 athletes competed in the men's and 26 athletes in the women's category this year.

THE ASTURIAN SAILING WEEK

The XVI Asturian Sailing Week, organised by Lucano Yacht Club and sponsored by EDP Foundation and Cajastur, was held from 15 to 20 July.




IV CASTRO TRIATHLON

CYCLING FESTIVAL

As in previous year, the EDP-Basque Cycling Foundation organised the party to mark the end of the cycling season. Over 2,500 people joined in and cycled along a route around the Seminary.

INTERNATIONAL BASKETBALL TRAINING CAMP

Organised by the Baskonia Foundation, with players from the Caja Laboral Baskonia team being present and overseen by international basketball coaches, the skills-perfecting clinic was held for young people aged 14 to 17.

**EDP UNDER 23 AMATEUR CYCLING TEAM**

The EDP Under-23 cycling team was set up in 2008 and since then it has resolutely pursued its challenge to support young cycling talent in their sport, academic and personal training. The integral training philosophy, combining studies and sport, continued to underpin the preparation of the most admired up and coming teams in the Basque Country in 2014.

**EUSKADI KIROLAK FUNDAZIOA - BAT**

Sponsorship agreement with the Euskadi Kirolak Foundation to ensure a correct pathway for Basque sports at elite level. This will result in an ample representation in elite sports competitions at international level, fundamentally in the top sports events, along with achieving first-class results by Basque athletes in those competitions.

EDP-SESTAO CHESS CLUB

The European Chess Club Cup 2014, the Champions League for chess, was held in Bilbao with nearly 100 clubs and around 600 chess players from around the world taking part. This event was an opportunity for world elite players to use the Club's facilities and play matches alongside the children that regularly train at Club's school, which was a huge boost for the young chess players.

ÁVILA SWIMMING CLUB

The EDP Foundation worked with the Ávila Swimming Club where three hundred swimmers in the junior, youth and senior categories and a handful of infants and masters took part in an event that brought together thirteen clubs, eleven of them from Castilla y León and two from the Madrid Autonomous Region.

SOLIDARITY

ASPA NOVAS

The EDP Foundation and the ASPANOVAS Foundation signed a contract to run music therapy and laughter therapy workshops for the patients in the Child Cancer Unit at the Barakaldo Cruces Hospital.

EDP also provides inflatables and the finish line for an ASPANOVAS children's party, which was organised as a get-together for the families and the children with cancer, while raising awareness among the general public.



CANTABRIA DOWN'S SYNDROME FOUNDATION

Contribution to the charity calendar that the Cantabria Down's Syndrome Foundation issues every year. A total of 2,200 calendars with photos of the young people and the different activities they do were produced. All the money raised from the calendars are used in full to finance the activities organised by the Cantabria Down's Syndrome Foundation.



RESPONSIBLE POINTS

Points is a totally free programme rewarding EDP customers with a series of points that can be accumulated in the following ways: for each kWh of gas or electricity consumed, for registering new contracts, for every year that the customers belong to the points programme, for taking part in EDP schemes, etc.

The accumulated points can be exchanged for gifts or donated to charity projects run by different NGOs. These are known as responsible points.

In 2014, EDP customers donated 24,564,000 responsible points. The EDP Foundation, which would like to thank all the donors, matched that amount of points. The equivalent amount in money came to €49,000, which has been.

SED FUNDATION SUMMER CAMPS

The EDP Foundation sponsorship meant that two camps organised by the Society, Education and Development Foundation (SED), could be held:

- Spiral Work Camp Aimed at helping vulnerable people or at risk in Fuenlabrada (Madrid). It consisted of two 2-week activities: a 2014 Urban Camp for 75 young people aged 4 to 14 and a 2014 Women's School for 20 women over 18 years old.
- Educational bolstering for young people excluded or at risk in Castilla y León. This year the Urogallo Urban Camp and Camping requested by Cáritas de Astorga y Ponferrada was the selected project. Sixty boys and girls took part in a 1-week camp in June plus the urban camp throughout July.
